

# President's Message

#### **Only One Way**

I picked up my grandson Layne for kindergarten this morning as usual. As we backed out of the driveway, he said, "Let's take a different way to school this morning, Grandma." I thought about it. "There is only one way to your school." I said.

Layne and his family live about 6 blocks west, and on the same street, as Martin Luther School in Bismarck. There really is only one way - straight east on Avenue C. We could have turned

I got to thinking.... there is really only one way to heavenby grace, through faith in Jesus Christ. ### April, 2008 ~ Official Call to Convention!


All members of the ND LWML,

Each unit may select two delegates who shall have voice and vote at the convention. The names and addresses of these delegates and alternates for each delegate must be in the hands of the District Recording Secretary no later than May 27, 2008. This is mandated by our bylaws.

#### REGISTRATION

A convention registration form can be found in this publication of the Messenger. All Registration forms are due by **May 31, 2008**; with no refund given after June 14, 2008. Forms along with payment will be sent to Louise Tegtmeier.

#### HOUSING

Each person attending the convention is responsible for their own housing accommodations. Rooms are being held at the Holiday Inn (701-282-2700). When calling for reservations, be sure to mention that you are with the LWML for a rate of \$99.95 a night. **Or you may choose to stay as a guest in a local LWML'ers home**. Please call Beth Fortier at 701-388-4536 about this option. Available homes are limited to first-come, first-served.

#### **CONVENTION SITE**

The convention will be held at the Holiday Inn, 3803 13th Ave South, Fargo, North Dakota.

#### **AGENDA**

Registration will be held at the Holiday Inn on Friday between the hours of 12:30—6:00 pm. Servant events will begin at 1:00 pm. A Mission Festival and fellowship time (5:30—7:00) followed by Opening Worship at 7:30 will be held at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 1005 1st Street East, West Fargo. We will meet in convention from 8:00 am to 5:15 pm on Saturday. Convention hours will be 8:30 am—until about 11:30 am on Sunday. We will worship directly after the close of convention at the Holiday Inn. Your families are invited to join both worship services.

#### YOUNG/NEW WOMEN

Encourage young women or women new to the LWML to attend the convention or to serve as a

delegate. Help to send a third (non-voting) representative so she can be an active recipient of what LWML has to offer.

#### SERVANT EVENTS

Servant events will be held Friday afternoon between 1:00-4:00 pm. The following four events will be held at the Holiday Inn:

Marking Bibles for prison ministry—pens and instructions will be provided.

Blood mobile—If you sign up to give blood you will be contacted to set up a time. The bloodmobile will be in the Holiday Inn parking

A member of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Napoleon, Ohio, Pat is married to Josef Kuckelkorn. She has three adult children and four grandchildren.



#### MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS FOR 2008-2010

#### MG 600 - \$2,500 India School Project

Location: India

**Goal:** To renew school buildings founded by LCMS World Mission missionaries 50-70 years ago in order that Christian witnessing may continue to take place freely in government-sponsored settings.

**Needs:** Renewing school buildings in India so the government will not close the schools due to unsafe conditions.

Additional Information: Schools are a major Christian witness in their communities in spite of an adverse political climate. Parents want to send their children to Christian schools because of the spirituality and sincerity of the Christian teachers. The church also has an opportunity to educate its own members and equip them with skills for outreach through the schools. The India Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELC) has taken on 25 million of the Ablaze goal of reaching 100 million with the Gospel by 2017. The IELC schools are key to it's Ablaze program, for they can reach children and families from all caste backgrounds.

#### MG 601 - \$2,500 Beautiful Feet Mission Conference

Location: USA

**Goal:** To encourage college students to get involved in mission activity in the schools, community, country, and world.

**Needs:** Transportation funds for students to get to and from the mission event.

Additional Information: Beautiful Feet, started by students in the Concordia University system, builds up the future missionaries, church lay leadership and pastors to encourage them in their mission outreach efforts and give them the resources to begin or continue their own mission activities. Attendees have a history of filling various volunteer and career missionary positions around the world through LCMS World Mission.

#### MG 602 - \$3,000 Lay Leadership Training—China

Location: Training takes place in China

Goal: To train and equip local church leaders with

theological education and training they need to be more effective church leaders; to continue to encourage Chinese Christians in their faith.

**Needs:** Local church leaders are asked to lead Bible studies and worship services with little training. They ask for more training and resources to continue to reach out with the true Gospel message.

**Additional Information:** Chinese Christians face many difficult circumstances. They are requesting not money but the opportunity to learn how to effectively share the Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection with their communities.

#### MG 603 - \$3,000 Chapel Roofs—Guinea, West Africa

Location: Guinea

**Goal:** To provide roofs for chapels where our brothers and sisters in Christ worship and coordinate outreach efforts.

**Needs:** Roofs for chapels (completed buildings) and tarps for grass-roofed buildings.

Additional Information: LCMS World Mission made a promise to the Christians in Guinea that if congregations would build a chapel up to the roof level, LCMS World Mission would supply the roof. Many West African refugees have fled to Guinea to escape civil war and persecution in Liberia and Sierra Leone. The church has been growing so quickly that the financing has not been able to keep up with the church growth!

#### MG 605 - \$5,000 Christian Education for Punjab Children

Location: Punjab, India

Goal: The goal is to provide Christian education for the Sikh, Hindu, and Muslim children of Dasuha. It is anticipated that 80-87% of the students will be from non-Christian families who will send their children for the quality and discipline that Christian education can provide. This school will be attached to the first Lutheran congregation planted in Punjab, India, Lutheran Church of Everlasting Life. LCMS World Mission in partnership with POBLO wants to plant LCMS congregations in these areas of Northern and Central areas of India where these groups are not being reached with the gospel.

**Needs:** Very large farming communities dominate the economy of Punjab. A majority of the population practices the Sikh faith. Good mission schools are found in cities as far as 150 miles from the town of Dasuha. Dasuha itself, therefore, is badly in need of Christian education. From the perspective of missions, a strong rationale for this project is that many in the Dasuha community are receptive to the Christian faith.

**Additional Information:** Very important for outreach and evangelism to students coming from Hindu, Sikh, and Muslim backgrounds-there is no second option for these children in terms of Christian education.

#### MG 606 - \$7,500 Orphan Grain Train—ND Division

Location: Based in Bottineau, ND

**Goal:** To help needy people with material resources as well as spreading the saving Gospel of our Lord Jesus.

**Needs:** Shipping costs, food items, and funds to supplement ministry, especially in Liberia.

Additional Information: Volunteers do all the work and funds to operate all come from contributions by individuals and groups. OGT continues to meet the physical and spiritual needs of destitute people from Russia, Latvia, Liberia, Mexico, and the needs of those who have suffered natural disasters in our own country and state.

#### MG 607 - \$1,000 Music Ministry— All Faith's Chapel

Location: All Faith's Chapel, Grafton, ND.

**Goal:** All Faith's Chapel music ministry is an effort to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a winsome way first of all to people with developmental disabilities and then to others through original music and Bible study on CD.

**Needs:** To purchase CDs, CD covers and liner notes and cover printing. Cost of finished and printed CDs is approximately \$2.00. Mailing is \$1.46 a copy. Each run of CDs is 200 copies and each mailing is 90. Cost for one run is \$531.60.

**Additional Information:** Pastor Bernie Seter, Grafton, is using his musical gifts to make these CD's and share them, thus bringing the gospel to many people. It is used extensively among the clientele at Grafton. It is used in the local churches and has made it's way around the world to Africa and Germany. It aligns with Synod's goal to reach 100 million with the Gospel by

2017. A note would be put in each CD that this is a gift from the ND LWML.

#### MG 608 - \$5,000 DEAF INSTITUTE OF THEOLOGY (TRAINING OF DEAF LEADERS AND PASTORS)

Location: D.I.T. at Concordia Seminary - St. Louis

**Goal:** The goal of the Deaf Institute of Theology (DIT) is to reach the over 100 million deaf people world-wide (who do not believe in Jesus) with Word and sacrament ministry by training and equipping deaf leaders to become deaf lay leaders and pastors.

**Needs:** Many districts and countries have asked for help in reaching the deaf. The position of Director of the Deaf Institute of Theology has been established to coordinate training and outreach. This is the only position that synod has which is dedicated to ministering to the deaf. Synod does not have funding for this position and it's work.

**Additional Information:** Over 150 deaf leaders are presently in the deaf lay mission training and six are in training to be pastors through DIT. Work has begun in Ghana, West Africa, India, and Canada. Invitations to begin work have come from many areas around the US and several other countries. The Lord's direction is prayerfully sought.

#### MG 610- \$2,000 Children's Bible Story Books for Southeast Asia

Location: Southeast Asia

**Goal:** To provide *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories* to children and families in Thai (Thailand), Khmer (Cambodia), and Bahasa (Indonesia) languages.

**Needs:** Through the Lutheran Heritage Foundation, LHF translators and those using these materials (especially *Luther's Small Catechism*) found that typically younger people with young families were most open to learning more about the Christian faith. Lutheran children's books in their own languages are greatly needed to pass on that faith.

Additional Information: LHF can change this situation by translating and publishing Bible stories for children in several Southeastern Asian languages. After the translations, both theological and editorial reviewers will prepare the books for publication. Publication costs \$2.00 per copy in SE Asia. These books are then distributed through missionaries, pastors, churches, and Sunday Schools as well as through Lutheran Hour Min-

istries in SE Asia at no cost to the children or their families.

#### MG 611 - \$2,500 JEWISH MISSIONS RUSSIAN LITERATURE DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

**Location:** Apple of His Eye Mission in Moscow, Russia

**Goal:** To develop culturally relevant, confessionally based, mission focused messianic literature in Russian for use in personal evangelism among Jewish people in fulfillment of the Great commission and the LCMS *Ablaze*! initiative fostering individual personal conversations on the person of Jesus among Russian speaking Jewish people & Gentiles worldwide.

**Needs:** Ninety-nine percent of the 13 million Jewish people worldwide do not confess Jesus as their Messiah. It is an urgent need as they are facing a Christ-less eternity! The primary reason is not that they have read and rejected the Gospel message, but that it is perceived to be a foreign message with most materials couched in non-Jewish settings. Christians need effective materials to assist in their personal witness and to do effective messianic follow-up.

Additional Information: Funds will be used for literature development and translation into Russian. The Biblical mandate to bring the Gospel to the Jew first is still operative, but for the most part ignored by Christians. Romans 15:27 For if the Gentiles have shared in the Jews' spiritual blessings, they owe it to the Jews to share with them their material blessings. Steve Cohen has an MA in Missionlogy with Jewish studies emphasis and has been involved in mission work since 1976 and is overall leader for Jewish missions.

#### MG 612 - \$5,000 ND Lutheran Braille Work Centers

Location: Based in LCMS churches in Bottineau, Williston, and Hazen

**Goal:** To provide free Christian Braille with the Good News of Jesus Christ to the visually impaired around the world whom otherwise would not have access to God's Word.

**Needs:** Help to cover the costs of special weight paper, shipping cartons, binders, and tape needed to produce and ship the Christian Braille Books.

**Additional Information:** This is an ongoing project, staffed by committed volunteers. Each Braille center

produces different Christian publications such as the Bible, devotionals, and hymnals. (Different languages are also produced) Requests for material grow daily world-wide. There are over 200 Lutheran Braille Work Centers in the US. Only three are in ND.

#### MG 614 - \$3,500 THE SERVANT'S HEART—GUATEMALA— HOPE FOR A FUTURE

Location: Guatemala City, Guatemala

**Goal:** To fund one classroom of children so each one knows that he or she is a precious child, a chosen child of our Lord and that there is a hope for the future (Jeremiah 29:11).

Needs: Thousands of children live in the shanty villages along the trash dump in Guatemala City & have little hope of a life outside the dump. Most of these children are not able to attend school at all. The path to breaking the cycle of poverty - abject poverty - is through each child understanding they are a gift of God; that God has provided them each with many gifts - especially the ultimate gift of Jesus Christ's sacrifice for them; and through academic and vocational training.

Additional Information: The Servant's Heart has been serving in Guatemala City since 1991 when Carla Burnell saw the plight of those living and working in the city dump. The majority of these people were of Mayan descent and had never been given the opportunity to go to school. Mayan women were forbidden to learn to read and write until very recently. In January, 2005 by God's grace and including a large grant from LWML, we flung open the doors of El Colegio Luterano El Corazon Del Servidor to 160 students and 10 teachers.

#### MG 615 - \$5,000 FOOD & CLOTHING CO-OP— SEMINARY, FORT WAYNE

**Location:** Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana

**Goal:** To provide perishable and non-perishable food items and personal care products to seminary students and their families at no cost.

**Needs:** Nearly 70% of the student body today are second career men with families. When these men make the momentous decision to quit their jobs and come to the seminary, these families are thrown into a difficult financial position.

Additional Information: Our church is in need of faithful men to spiritually nurture and care for the forgiven children of God as well as bring the lost into the fold. We need to physically nurture these men and their families, so we may prepare them well for their service to the church. The seminary expects to serve approximately 600 people this year, over half of whom are children.

#### MG 616- \$3,000 CHRIST THE WAY—RADIO

Location: Based in Jamestown, ND

**Goal:** To spread the Word of God by area Pastors via the Radio.

Needs: Air time, tapes, and postage.

Additional Information: Christ the Way proclaims God's Word to many in the community who are not able to attend a worship service and do not have a church home. The program has a good listener audience and comments are that it is very much enjoyed and a blessing to all, especially shut-ins. Listeners enjoy listening to the different Pastors.

### MG 617 - \$3,000 TUITION ASSISTANCE—MARTIN LUTHER SCHOOL

Location: Bismarck, ND-- Martin Luther School

**Goal:** The grant will provide funds to offer assistance to needy families for tuition payments to Martin Luther School.

**Needs:** Many families come to us wanting their children to have a Christ-centered education, but cannot afford it.

**Additional Information:** Each year we award six to seven thousand dollars in tuition assistance. With this grant, we could significantly raise that amount. Everyone should have access to Christian education!

#### MG 618 - \$3,000 BC Mission Boat Society

Location: Home base is Parksville, B.C., Canada

**Goal:** To show and bring the love of Jesus Christ, by a ship based mission, to the remote British Columbia coastal communities.

**Needs:** Funds to pay for training local people and training materials for volunteers, evangelism courses,

and Bible studies.

Additional Information: The mission boat goes out for the months of July and August and land-based teams visit places that are accessible by land and water taxi throughout the year, thus enriching the ministry, maintaining relationships, and providing ongoing support. The Mission Boat Society is a training area for interns of the Oswald Hoffmann School of Evangelism of Concordia University, St. Paul, Minnesota. The pastoral leadership of this Boat Society was a son of St. John Lutheran of Kongsberg. Rev. Robert Koebernick was baptized, confirmed, and ordained there. Since the Lord has seen fit to call Rev. Bob and his wife to Himself, the LWML Unit of St. John, Kongsberg, would like to have this project adopted in their memory and to God's glory.

#### MG 619- \$10,000 ND DISTRICT LCMS START— SOUTH FARGO & NORTH BISMARCK

Location: South Fargo, ND and North Bismarck, ND.

**Goal:** To further the work of our Lord in fast growing areas of North Dakota, two mission planters have been called into service.

**Needs:** We need to take care of the basic needs of the mission planters (pastors) - salary, benefits, housing, and immediate needs so they may do their work in preparation of their new congregations.

**Additional Information:** The need for mission starts is great and exciting and anything we can do to assist and show our support will be God pleasing. This grant will assist our ND LCMS District, freeing up funds for them to use in other areas.

#### MG 620 - \$5,000 PROJECT 24

Location: Kenya, East Africa

**Goal:** Five laymen from North Dakota recently returned from Kenya and, after viewing the devastation caused by AIDS and hearing the bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church express his need for 24 orphan rescue centers, decided to do something.

**Needs:** 14 million Kenyan children have lost one or both parents to AIDS. Consequently, the Lutheran church in Kenya is desperate to house, feed, and clothe these children. Every church in Kenya is in fact an orphanage.

**Additional Information:** Cost of the average rescue center is approximately \$40,000. Every dollar raised will be matched by LCMS World Relief and Human Care.

# MG 621 - \$3,000 THE RECRUITMENT, TRAINING, AND EQUIPPING OF NATIVE AMERICANS FOR FULL-TIME CHURCH WORK AND MINISTRY

**Location:** American Indian Native Alaskan communities within the U.S.

**Goal:** The primary focus of the Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots U.S. is to identify, recruit, train, equip, and empower Native Americans for ministry to their own and to others.

**Needs:** The cost of equipping and empowering a native person through this program is approximately \$15,000 to \$30,000 per year, depending upon individual circumstances, including salary for part-time ministry, ministry costs, and tuition.

**Additional Information:** Having Native Americans who know the language, culture, legends, and traditions of their people is so beneficial when it comes to bringing them into a saving relationship with Jesus Christ and in ministering to their own (of whom less than 3% know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior).

#### MG-622 - \$2,500 Bibles for International Students

Location: Ministry sites across the U.S.A.

**Goal:** A grant of \$5,000 would provide Bibles for a large number of our ministry sites around the country and potentially give 500 international students and children a copy of the Bible in their language or in English. If full funding of \$5,000 were not received, we would distribute \$250 to ministry sites on a first come first served basis.

**Needs:** Currently, there are over 80 LCMS ministries at colleges and universities where Bible study is essential in bringing Christ to international students. Bible classes are usually conducted in English, and they are greatly enhanced when students can use bi-lingual Bibles. One international scholar said it in these words: "I learned much information about Jesus and the Bible in English, but I learned to *love* Him when I read about Him in Chinese.

**Additional Information:** Children of these scholars eagerly want to learn English and the American way of

life. What better way than to be given an age appropriate children's Bible. There is no source of regular funding to purchase these bi-lingual Bibles, or Bibles in the native languages of international students. ISM Inc. is an LCMS mission society that works in partnership with LCMS World Mission to train workers for ministry among internationals and to assist them in praying for and raising money for their ministries. Their primary mission is to minister amongst visiting international students, scholars and their families, reaching out in friendship, hospitality, educational programs and with the saving gospel message of Jesus Christ. No other LCMS organization has this as their primary mission.

#### MG 623 - \$4,000 PRODUCTION OF LARGE TYPE MATERIALS— NEW SALEM

**Location:** Work center at Zion Lutheran Church, New Salem, ND

**Goal:** To assist the work center in New Salem with the supplies needed to produce large type materials for Lutheran Blind Mission.

**Needs:** Paper, spines, envelopes, etc.

Additional Information: This is the only mission that produces scripture calendars and magazines in the LCMS and provides them to readers at no cost. Zion church produces all of the scripture calendars, over 4200 in all and over 1,800 copies of the LWML Quarterly each year. Annual large type costs for all of Lutheran Blind Ministries magazines is \$26,871.64.

#### MG 624 - \$2,500 Missionary candidate Training—LBT

Location: Training in Dallas, Texas

Goal: The goal of the project is to provide excellent training for Lutheran Bible Translators' missionaries who are preparing for the ministry of Bible translation so that they can help people have the powerful Word of God in their own language, the language that touches their hearts.

**Needs:** At any given time, Lutheran Bible Translators has a number of missionary candidates in training at the Graduate Institute of Applied Linguistics in Dallas, Texas. Each of these candidates has a need for help in paying tuition costs.

**Additional Information:** The funds will be used to pay for tuition and books at the Institute in Dallas

where they receive their specialized training in the fall of 2008 and the spring and fall of 2009. There are still more than 3,000 languages into which the Word of God has not been translated. There is an urgent need to get more people involved in this work as soon as possible. LBT is the only Lutheran mission agency focused on Bible translation.

#### MG 625 - \$6,000 CURRICULUM UPGRADE— LYNCH IMMANUEL LUTHERAN SCHOOL

**Location:** Lynch Immanuel Lutheran School - Glenburn, ND

**Goal:** To upgrade the school's Christian and secular curriculums and allow us to better proclaim the Gospel to the children, their families, and friends.

**Needs:** The Preschool and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade need a Christian curriculum. The Preschool secular curriculum needs to be upgraded to the same curriculum as that used by the Kindergarten and the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade. The Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade secular curriculum needs to finish the upgrade that was started in 2006 and 2007 respectively.

Additional Information: Lynch Immanuel Lutheran School is a necessary mission field in a predominantly rural neighborhood with a major military installation located within it's midst, and has already drawn new members to the LCMS church. There is a greater need for a private Christian education in our area. Enhancing our Christian and secular educational offerings, would give us a much more attractive educational package to offer the parents in our community and enhance our ability to proclaim the Gospel to children and their families and friends.

#### MG 626 - \$4,000 ND DISTRICT KID'S & ENCOUNTER CAMPS

**Location:** Shepherd's Hill at the Crossroads, St. John, ND

**Goal:** To help keep cost of registration at our youth camps (Kid's camp and Encounter Camp) at a reasonable amount so all youth will have the opportunity to attend. The nurturing of Christ centered relationships at the camps is priceless!

**Needs:** To defray all costs related to the operation of our Bible camps.

**Additional Information:** These monies are not distributed to individual children, but rather lower the cost of camp for all students. Registration fees for campers without a subsidy would be approximately \$185 per

child, which would make camp too expensive for many youth.

#### MG 627 - \$30,000 ND Full-time Church Worker's Scholarships

Location: Distributed by ND-LCMS District Office

**Goal:** To help students with their financial needs and obligations while attending school to become full-time church workers.

**Needs:** Financial aid to help the students with the costs needed to complete their education.

**Additional Information:** Our youth and adults who feel called to be educated and work for the LCMS as full-time church workers need to be encouraged and helped as they serve the Lord in a wide mission field. The cost of education continues to escalate and is often a burden for those who desire to serve the Lord. This grant will help them and encourage them as they pursue their education.

#### MG 629 - \$8,000 SOUTH FARGO MISSION (FURNISHING CROSSPOINTE)

Location: Fargo, ND

**Goal:** The goal of the project would be to provide funding which would be used to purchase chancel and sanctuary furnishings for Crosspointe Lutheran Church in South Fargo.

Needs: Crosspointe Lutheran Church is a new mission church of the ND LCMS located in Southwest Fargo. The congregation has a building which is part of the Good Samaritan Assisted Living Center. The church needs furnishings for the chancel, such as altar, lectern, pulpit, baptismal font, and chancel seating. They also need chairs or pews for the sanctuary. Altar ware, paraments, and other items will also be needed for this new congregation.

**Additional Information:** This mission congregation is a collaborative project of the ND District LCMS. This is an opportunity for the LWML to be a part of this new mission. SW Fargo is a rapidly growing area and there are many people in need of the gospel. This congregation will reach out with God's love to the people of the area. A well furnished church will welcome those who are seeking a place to worship.


