LWML Exceeds Mite Goal!

Praise God! The LWML has exceeded its 2007-09 mission goal of \$1.7 million by \$75,730.17.

"The greater 'LWML family' actively met and

exceeded the mite goal for 2007-2009," LWML President Jan Wendorf said. "People from all over responded to God's love in their own lives and joined together by



God's grace and provision to accomplish this. I am humbled and honored by the trust given to Lutheran Women in Mission to be about their Father's business while it is still day. Sincere thanks to all who contributed."

Among contributions received by the March 31 deadline was an anonymous memorial gift of \$100,000.

LCMS President Gerald Kieschnick sent his congratulations to the women of the LWML: "What a blessing from the hand of the Lord, made possible, humanly speaking, by the generous hearts of some of His most precious children-the wonderful women of the LWML! The support provided by LWML for the LCMS and its related ministries is vital for the ongoing mission of our Synod and is most sincerely appreciated. Please communicate my sincere and heartfelt appreciation, on behalf of our entire Synod, to all the wonderful women among whom you are privileged to work and to lead."



Mountain Top Experiences

"I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth." (Psalm 121:1-2)

Sue and I returned from Portland, Oregon from attending the National LWML Convention. We were on a high from visiting the coast, participating in the convention and then touring Mt. St. Helens. We were in the clouds with joy and blessings from our Lord. We came back knowing, but hoping that we would not fall back into the hum-drum of everyday life.

But then we jumped into the car on Sunday afternoon and headed for Aspen, CO, for a Grace Place Retreat. We again found ourselves in the Mountains and awe of God's wonderful creation. We met other couples, one I recognized from Seminary, another we "clicked" with right away, others we had been acquaintances with and still others, we met for the first time. Everyone was wonderful, friendly and Christian! We were presented with "centering prayer", with how to say "no" when our ministry interferes with our families, with some simple exercises for our bodies and with wonderful devotions of uplifting meditations for our soul.

We returned and wondered if we would come back to the hum-drum of our lives. Sue will need to go back to work on Monday and return to those needs. We kept asking each other, how our lives have been changed and what we can do to continue this change.

I leave for District Kids Kamp on Sunday afternoon to spend another week in the Mountains, albeit the Turtle Mountains, but mountains nevertheless and I am sure it will again be another mountain top experience.

Each experience we have gone through has to change us. We cannot let those who have stayed behind in the valley bring us back down. The charge that we have is to bring those who were left behind up with us. We may not get them to the top, but to get them out of the valleys of the shadow of death is a priority that we cannot pass up.

We have all experienced these mountain top feelings and when we return to our homes, we see people who have not experienced them and are still doing the same

things. We learned this past week that if you keep doing the same thing over and over, you will continue to get the same results over and over or even less. So I suggest that we do something different. Invite people to coffee or cookies or someplace to share your experience. Don't keep it to yourself and think that it was just a great thing and now reality hits. Reality is that Christ died for the forgiveness of your sins and has earned for us eternal life. That's an experience that we need to share, we cannot go around thinking that everyone knows that or even has had an experience of how huge that love is.

I know, as Lutherans, we have been taught not to believe in feelings, but they are there and to deny them is to deny that Jesus had enough feelings to die for us. Those feelings will never earn for us salvation, but feelings will motivate us to share our faith with others. That is the mountain top feeling that we receive at a convention, at a retreat and at camp. Let's continue those feelings to all those around us when we return.

Gifts from the Heart items brought by convention attendees included 308 Health Kits, 194 Art Kits, 697 packages of socks, 308 Teddy Bears, 421 packages of T-shirts. These gifts will be shared with people we will never meet; but we pray their hearts will be touched with God's love through these gifts.

Our God reigns here in North Dakota also. The LWML District Retreat is coming up on September 11-13, 2009 at the Chieftain in Carrington. Please plan now to attend this wonderful weekend of JOY. Along with Bible studies, speaker Jan Struck, fellowship and food there will

be two Gifts from the Heart ingatherings. One is sanitary pads for young girls in Liberia. Because they do not have the pads they need, they are forced to miss school during their periods each month. This would be a wonderful way to show God's love and caring to these young women.

The second ingathering is for the First Choice Clinics in North Dakota. These clinics help young mothers to choose life for their babies and they often need the help that is offered to them. Items donated must be new and for children infant to 13 months. Possible gifts include diapers, socks, t-shirts, burp cloths, rattles, teething items. A unit-sponsored "Baby shower" would be a great way to gather some items before the retreat.

And, of course, please keep in mind the North Dakota LWML District convention scheduled for June 18-20, 2010 in Bismarck. Put it on your calendar now. There will be more opportunities there to show Jesus' love through Servant Events and Gifts from the Heart ingatherings. The theme for the convention will be "Reign in My Heart" Deut 10:12

Convention Highlights

Delegates to the 33rd Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) adopted a \$1.825 million mission goal for the 2009-11 biennium. It is the largest in the organization's 67-year



history and will fund a record 19 mission grants.

More than 3,200 people attended the convention, held in Portland, Oregon on June 25-28 under the theme "Look to the Hills ... God Reigns," based on Psalm 121:1-2 and Isaiah 52:7.

The funds raised by the organization's 250,000 members nationwide over the next two years will be used to support the following mission grants:

In his sermon during the convention's opening worship service, Rev. Dr. Warren Schumacher spoke about God's reign and the rain garden on the rooftop of the Oregon Convention Center that captures nine acres of falling water. "God does rain on us abundantly, but here it is usually softly, slowly, and tenderly. ... Turn your umbrella upside down and catch the blessings."

In her president's report, LWML President Janice Wendorf of Grafton, Wisconsin, challenged the attendees to make a commitment to be "In the Word, honoring a daily appointment with the Father and His Word; Of the Word, made over by the Holy Spirit, forgiven, and restored; Walking with the Lord, totally confident of Christ's presence in serving and living."

Bible study leader Dr. Mary Hilgendorf, Professor of Education at Concordia University Wisconsin, encouraged participants to look at women of the Bible with new eyes and shared her background as a pastor's daughter in Chester, Illinois.

In her keynote address, Ruth N. Koch invited convention attendees to join her on a virtual hike up the "Mountain of Change." She illustrated the importance of trying something new to welcome all women into the LWML.

The 601 delegates also elected new officers to help lead the organization over the next four years. Elected for four-year terms were:

- Patti Ross of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Vice President of Christian Life
- Linda Arnold of Woodridge, Illinois, Vice President of Communication
- Marilyn McClure of Tucson, Arizona, Vice President of Gospel Outreach
 - Judy Carlson of Paola, Kansas, Recording Secretary
- Rev. Kristopher Whitby of Arlington Heights, Illinois, Pastoral Counselor.

Newly-elected members of the Nominating Committee are Dianne Diekmann of Yankton, South Dakota, who will serve as chairman; Lois Ford of Eustis, Florida; Pam Kercher of Billings, Montana; Melody Rosenwinkel of Irwin, Idaho; and Marcia Wittenburg of Baker, Louisiana.

The convention featured processions with banners from all 40 LWML districts and the flags of 38 of the 50 countries where the LCMS has missionaries; activities for children and youth; a "Mission in Motion" pledge walk and exercise; inspiration from speaker Heidi Floyd, of the Vera Bradley Foundation for Breast Cancer; presentations by Lutheran missionaries; and performances by singer Lauren Randall and the Pride of Portland.

In the last Messenger this column encouraged the generous use and sharing of the Portals of Prayer that appear in the entryways of our churches. Below is a summary of the many ways units throughout the district are involved in Christian living including the use of Portals of Prayer by units throughout the district:

All units have Bible studies at every meeting and some have other Bible studies in the congregation as well.

All units gather mites at every meeting and some give the congregation opportunities to participate in mites, too.

Mission grant recipients are featured in bulletins or newsletters.

Special events are planned to include non-members (salad suppers, mother-daughter teas, Saturday brunches, Valentine party, etc.)

Prayers are offered for others through prayer chains Ministries of the LCMS are learned about and supported with prayer and financial support.

Many units are involved with quilt-making for charities, Shepherd's Hill auction, seniors from the congregation upon their graduation.

Care packages for members in active duty in the military.

Some provide Portals of Prayer for every household of the congregation. Most have them available in the narthex.

Most units have church libraries that include Christian books, children's Bible stories, various Bible translations, devotion books, tapes, CD's, DVD's....

Some units have a box of toys available for small children to use during Bible studies and meetings.

A few reported having "quiet" books or bags for small children to use during worship.

"My Devotions" and "Happy Times" are given to children by some.

Families with baptized children are remembered through Cradle Roll.

Used Bibles and Portals of Prayer are given to Prisons, missionaries, Orphan Grain train.

Many units lead devotions at nursing homes either weekly or monthly.

Students studying for church work receive financial aid from units.

Many units did bring guests or first timers to fall and spring rallies and the district convention.

Some units have celebrations, give gifts, or are prayer partners for confirmation students

How exciting it is to see what God is doing in ND through you! What a privilege we have to live in response to our wonderful Savior, to live in His love, and to share His love with others. Mentor . . . Prayerfully seek a mentor who shows strengths in areas you are weak in and seek to mentor those who are weak in areas you are strong in.

Effective . . . Mentoring is effective if the mentor is committed to just a few mentoring relationships. If everyone reaches out to someone else, all will be encouraged.

Nurturing . . . Mentoring is for nurturing friendships, for support, guidance, love, encouragement and learning.

Tasks . . . Pair experienced workers with learners to complete group tasks.

Opportunity . . . Allow others the opportunity to learn and grow in service by delegating and mentoring instead of doing it all yourself.

Relationships . . . When you make mistakes in mentoring relationships, ask for forgiveness and learn from your mistakes.

Invite . . . Instead of assuming a newcomer knows about an event, personally invite her. It will make her feel special and may also make you aware of a need.

New...Try new things. Mentoring relationships may develop when other women are interested in learning a new skill.

God . . . The person God chooses for you to have a mentoring relationship with may not be someone who is in your usual circle of friends. Make an effort to meet new people.

Each zone chooses someone to run for this position. An election is held and the nominee with the most votes is elected as chairman.


- ❖ attends all ND LWML Board meetings
