Depending on the emperor's mood, Christians could face death in any number of ways, including crucifixion, being burned at the stake, or being torn apart by wild animals in front of thousands of cheering people in the Coliseum.

Yet those words inspired by the Holy Spirit, have enabled countless Christians over the centuries to endure torture and even death without renouncing their faith in Jesus Christ the Lord.

What, if any, significance do those words have for us today?
