KEYNOTE Speaker, Nabil Subhi Nour, 56, is a naturalized U.S. citizen; however, he grew up in Nazareth, Israel where many family members still reside He is a Palestinian by nationality, and came to the U.S. at the age of 16 with no English skills.He entered the 11th grade at Huron High School in South Dakota.

Learning English was a very difficult and demanding effort. He continued his education at Huron College (now Huron University) and graduated in 1979 with a B. S. degree in criminology and sociology, with minors in psychology and



gerontology. In 1977, he married Jean Marie Miedema of Hitchcock, S.D Into this marriage three lovely sons were given.

After converting to Lutheranism, he received encouragement to consider the pastoral office from his fellow church members and pastor. In 1989, he entered Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis, MO and graduated in 1994. He is now a servant of the most High God and Lord, in His vineyard at Armour, South Dakota; he is also continuing his studies from CTS.

Pastor Nour travels and lectures often on how to live the Christian life in a postmodern time; How to Witness to Muslims; the true meaning of love; sharing the Good News of our Salvation; Laugh, Love and Live; other topics.

come with me. Of course that is not possible, but I preached about the body of Christ today and how Christ's work of redemption has made us one. We all look forward to the day when that oneness is fully realized in the life to be revealed when Christ comes again.
