"Wanna Have a Water Fight?"

"Quenched! By the Water!" As exciting and wonderful of an experience that the national LWML convention in Pittsburgh was, it lacked one thing. With a theme like "Quenched! By the Water!" I kept looking for the water balloons, super soakers and squirt guns! Apparently I must have read the registration material incorrectly. I thought it said to bring these items with you. Instead, it must have read: "Please leave all water balloons, super soakers, and squirt guns at home" because I didn't see anybody ready for a water fight, except the youth from Camp Kidsburgh who were prepared to take on the LWML national executive board.

I remember the days of teaching the 7th grace class in Vacation Bible School all day long. Some of the students in my class asked if we could have a water fight. I always love a good water fight. But what about the rest of the VBS students. After much prayer and fasting I decided to have a lesson in baptism on the last day of VBS with all the students. You got it...we had a water fight!!! After we were all dripping wet, I did a closing devotion in the sanctuary about baptism and the importance of the water in baptism as God's means of giving us His grace in the forgiveness of our sins.

In the waters of baptism we are connected to the 'fight' against sin, death and the devil which Jesus won for us! Romans 6:3-5 says: Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His.

The "fight" which took place on the cross was the "fight" against the devil which Jesus won **for us!!** We have the benefits of this victory through the waters of baptism. We are now forgiven, we no longer live under the power of the devil and we are heaven bound! So...when we talk about being "Quenched! By the Water!" we are confessing that we have the victory over sin, death, and the devil through faith in the Person & Work of Jesus alone! A water fight would have pictured this "battle" **and victory** because in a water fight everybody wins!! 

A Mountain Top Experience at National LWML Convention

Greetings from St. Andrew, Niagara, ND & Janice Schmidt, zone delegate privileged to represent the Northeastern Zone of ND at the Lutheran Women's Missionary League 35th Biennial convention held at Pittsburgh, PA, June 27-30, 2013.

Being a first-time attendee, this indeed was an eye-opener, mountain top experience!! I had no idea that the women of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod do so much to share God, His Ways, & His Word with people throughout our, much in need, whole world. To God be the Glory!

Nine North Dakotans rode with approximately 40 Minnesota North District people for a fun day and one-half bus trip. We left early on Wed., June 26th, from Fergus Falls, MN, picking up others at Alexandria, St. Cloud, and Rogers, MN. We stayed overnight at South Bend, IN, arriving at Pittsburgh on Thursday about 1:30 p.m.

Our bus driver took our "Gifts from the Heart Kits" to be sorted with items brought by other districts of USA. A total of 21,954 were distributed to people in the Pittsburgh area. Amazing!

Upon arrival, we registered and left our Mission in Motion walk pledge sheets and money at the registration tables. Some went to choir rehearsal. Before we arrived, servant connection activities had been done. 1,000 encouragement cards, 350 quilts, 700 coloring books, 1,500 gospel bracelets, 600 marked prison ministry Bibles, 500 college bags (treats & supplies), 155 school backpacks, and 330 fleece blankets were made along with 39 units of blood being donated. Group pictures were then taken in late afternoon with about 30 from North Dakota participating.

The convention officially opened Thursday evening. President Kay Kreklau from Drayton, ND, NE Zone presided at all of the sessions. Button popping time—done with expertise and to God's glory. Thank you, Kay! Each session opened with a procession of special honored guests and banner recognition.

Thursday evening a heart-warming worship service with communion was held—approximately 3,100 plus attendees and 500 volunteers were present. The guest speaker spoke to us about the theme of the conference (John 4:1-30 "We are quenched by the water" (the Living Water—Jesus) His Spirit by God's Word so we can be "quenchers" so others will be quenched. A wonderful desire, responsibility and privilege to be called to share the gospel with every tribe and nation.

All of the sessions opened with uplifting sing-a-longs led by Dina Vendetti. Both Friday and Saturday, a Bible study was taught, again sharing, "Quenched by the Water". We learned about Jesus, a Jew and man, the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well, a Gentile and woman should not have even spoken to each other. He offered her Living Water—never to thirst again. She realized he was the Messiah (prophet) because He knew she had been married 5 times and now living with a man who was not her husband.

She left her water jar, rushed back to town and shared (the Disciples did not). She brought the town people back to hear Jesus for 2 days. Many got to know this was the Savior of the world. Where are we at? Are we concerned about our reputation, pre-judging, not helping, or putting people down when we should be sharing about God, His love, grace and mercy with others and looking forward to eternal life in heaven to glorify Him forever for He indeed is sovereign.

Friday morning, we 581 delegates were taught how to vote electronically. Throughout the convention we voted for new officers, amendments to the bylaws, and the selection of 18 of 30 mission grants (\$1,830,000 for 2013-2015 biennium) all decided in a matter of minutes. Modern technology—WOW! At noon Friday, we 800 first-timers, were privileged to have a luncheon with President Kay. At 5:00 p.m. 1,051 "Mission in Motion" participants walked to fulfill pledge donations brought from the districts. "Mites in Motion" also contributes a huge amount to the monies shared throughout the world.

Speakers gave us info as to what is currently being done in missions. Monies funded from 2011-2013: Working with Native Americans, in orphanages, education for women & children to cut down the horrors of human trafficking & prostitution, people dying from Malaria. Missionaries located in Haiti, Dominican Republic, Russia, Latin America, and Hong Kong.

Other activities: Report by President Kay, many reports & activities shared, greetings from LCMS President Dr. Rev. Matthew Harrison, report from Lutheran World Relief wanting 500,000 quilts, exhibit area of displays of organizations working with LWML.

The convention closed with another beautiful worship service on Sunday morning, installation of new officers, closing remarks, adjournment & goodbyes. We were back home on July 1st.

Thank you to all who worked with me to make it possible for me to attend and enjoy the convention—people from ND, MN, national office at Missouri, and people at the convention.

Quote from President Kay: "With the help of God, go and tell the world."


Orphan Grain Train Container

Christian literature, educational materials, and medical supplies. The container then went to the OGT headquarters in Norfolk, NE and was filled with boxes of processed rice meals, a "Kids

Against Hunger" program. The contents were valued at over \$60,000. From Nebraska, it will go by rail to NY and be shipped to Kenya.

We are also thankful to God for all the cash contributions given to the ND Branch—OGT which made this special shipment possible, as the cost is around \$15,000. this is a way of sharing Christ's mercy with the people of the Lutheran Church of Kenya. To God Be the Glory!
