ND Bus Heading for Des Moines

Bus travel to the LWML Convention in Des Moines, IA has been secured. Cost per person for the transportation to and from Des Moines on the bus, and to and from the hotel to the convention center and back each day, will be \$45.00.

The bus will leave Bismarck on Wednesday morning, June 24th, and will make stops along the interstate as needed to pick up riders—most likely Jamestown and Fargo—and other places if needed. All servant events, registration, etc. begin Thursday, June 25th, so we will have a relaxing evening in Des Moines prior to the convention.

The bus will arrive in Des Moines Wednesday evening. Hotel reservations will be obtained as a group; however, we are not able to reserve those rooms yet. The cost per room will be approximately \$170 per night for 1-4 people. We will be staying 4 nights (Wed. through Sat.), and the bus will leave Des Moines at noon on Sunday, June 28th (at the close of convention) and return to ND that evening.

What a special and wonderful gift I received at Christmas during my 3rd grade year! I was 8 years old and we were living near Stirum and I was attending school at Oakes. When I opened the gift I was a bit disappointed, wondering what in the world Mom and Dad were

thinking!

I had been wanting an electric train set (several years ago I forced Michelle to look all over with me for one to purchase - my nostalgic moment). Hoping and praying that was inside the box, but realizing the box was the wrong size for a train, I tore the paper off as fast as I could. Lying nestled in the bottom of the box was a green covered book with a picture of Jesus on the front holding a little lamb—my first Bible, a children's Bible.

Now remember—I was 8 years old and desperately desiring an electric train set. And to my dismay I received a Bible and gave my parents what was probably an extremely dismal response. 

Human Trafficking Luncheon Speakers



Rebekah Grimm is a North Dakota native who has always had a passion for social justice. Her passion for sex trafficking intensified when she traveled to Thailand and Cambodia over the summer of 2011. While there she was able to work with sex trafficking survivors and better understand the issue on an international level. After returning from this trip, Rebekah founded "Hope is Possible: the Fight to End

Sex Trafficking" on her college campus, Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota. While acting as president, Rebekah led numerous presentations, hosted a benefit concert, and brought a speaker to campus. She graduated from Concordia in 2012 with a degree in Social Work. After graduation Rebekah moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota, where she became employed as a Licensed Social Worker. During her free time she volunteered with Breaking Free as the assistant to the Women's Programming Director. In September of 2014 Rebekah started the Masters of Social Work program at the University of Minnesota where she is focusing her studies on "Community Practice: Advocacy, Organizing, and Leadership". She is currently an intern at the Battered Women's Justice Project in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Upon graduating in July of 2015, Rebekah looks forward to fighting sex trafficking on a larger scale by raising awareness, advocating for victims, and creating positive policy changes.



Dawnya Underwood is the Assistant Director for Children's Services in Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service's (LIRS) Children's Services Department. She has worked with the organization since 2009.

LIRS provides safety and protection to unaccompanied refugee minors and unaccompanied alien children through holistic transitional. LIRS helps them reunite with their family

members already living in the United States, when possible. Our specialized family reunification service strives to see that children are released into appropriate family settings as soon as possible.

Dawnya is responsible for the department's central administrative and logistical issues, and she also collaborates with internal departments and external organizations to maintain, expand, and develop efficient services.

Prior to joining LIRS, she was program manager at West Suburban PADS, an Illinois nonprofit serving the homeless. As program supervisor for Chicago's Metropolitan Family Services, Dawnya earned the 2005 Peter Fetzer Award and both the 2006 and 2007, Betty L. Stronger awards for her innovative improvements to the program's community network, efficiency, and overall ability to serve clients.

Through Dawnya's social service, community development, and leadership experience, she ensures that vulnerable migrant and refugee children are protected, embraced, and empowered by just and welcoming communities.
