



Krueger has also served as a lead trainer for Tentmaker's Leadership Training, a national training organization that equips church and parachurch professionals for greater effectiveness in Christian ministry.

MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS 2016—2018

MG 101 ~ \$35,000 ND FULL-TIME CHURCH WORKER SCHOLARSHIP

The North Dakota Church Worker Scholarship is a program administered by the North Dakota District LCMS for youth and adults who desire to be educated and become full-time workers in God's kingdom in the LCMS. This scholarship helps defray the cost of higher education as it continues to escalate so as not to become a burden for those students. The students who will benefit from these scholarships are members (or were at the time of their initial scholarship application) of North Dakota LCMS congregations.

MG 102 ~ \$7,500 ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN — ND BRANCH

The Orphan Grain Train (OGT)-ND Branch provides food, clothing, medical supplies, and God's Word to those in need. OGT's ministry reaches out to help people who have suffered losses in floods, droughts, tornadoes, hurricanes, and fires in the United States. Additionally, they offer aid to the destitute people of Russia, Latvia, Liberia, China, Mexico, Kenya, and Nepal. The funds for this grant will be used for various expenses including: building updates, heat, electricity, and insurance for the Jamestown warehouse; gas, license, and insurance for the OGT van; and shipping costs for containers of donated goods.

MG 103 ~ \$7,250 DAKOTA BOYS AND GIRLS RANCH (DBGR) — CHAPEL ALTAR, BAPTISMAL FONT AND EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch programs focus on spiritual health and wellness to achieve successful treatment of children and their families. To meet the spiritual needs of a growing client base, a chapel is being constructed at the DBGR Fargo Campus. An altar and baptismal font are needed to provide for and enhance the spiritual activities of worship. Spiritual life and training are essential components of DBGR's ministry and require Christian education materials that meet the needs of spiritual life groups, one-on-one teaching, and overall life development. The funds for this grant will be used to purchase these Christian education materials as well as a baptismal font and altar for the DBGR chapel.

MG 104 ~ \$5,000 GRACE LUTHERAN SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Grace Lutheran School is an LCMS-supported school serving families in the Fargo-Moorhead community offering a preschool through grade 8 Christian education. The school plays an active role in evangelism in the community to draw new members to LCMS churches through outreach to families of children who attend Grace Lutheran School. The funds for this grant will be used to increase the scholarship fund availability to allow families in need and families with financial strain to receive tuition assistance.

MG 105 ~ \$5,000 CHRIST THE WAY RADIO MINISTRY

Christ the Way radio program has been on the air in North Dakota since 1929. The 15-minute program airs over KSJB 600 AM in Jamestown every Sunday and is heard by people in North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, Montana, and Iowa. Christ the Way is directed by Pastor Tom Eckstein of Concordia Lutheran Church in Jamestown with the assistance of Philip Cherney, a member of Concordia. The messages are provided by LCMS pastors of the North Dakota District. The funds from this grant will be used to pay for production and broadcast costs of this radio ministry and provide stabilization of funds for future endeavors and potential rate increases.

MG 106 ~ \$8,000 PROVIDING SPIRITUAL AND EMOTIONAL SUPPORT FOR PASTORS

Providing Spiritual and Emotional Care for our Pastors is a program administered through the North Dakota District LCMS to assist pastors and their families who are in need of specific spiritual and emotional care. Two programs used by the LCMS for offering this care for pastors are "Doxology" and "Shepherd's Canyon." Both of these programs are committed to the emotional and spiritual healing of clergy and other church workers. The funds from this grant will be used to help pastors in need of spiritual and emotional care attend one of these recommended programs.

MG 107 ~ \$5,000 CONCORDIA FORT WAYNE FOOD CO-OP

The Food and Clothing Co-op on the campus of Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana,

plays a key role in helping students reduce the financial burden of seminarians and their families by providing access to food and clothing.. The funds from this grant will be used to purchase perishable items for the food bank (e.g., eggs, cheese, milk, fruit juice, ground beef, fresh fruits and vegetables, etc.) as well as additional grocery and paper products.

MG 108 ~ \$5,000 ASSISTING YOUTH TO "BE A FRIEND"/CAMP COUNSELOR INTERN AT BETHESDA SUMMER CAMP

The "Be a Friend"/Camp Counselor Intern Bethesda Auxiliary project seeks to enable life-changing relationships between campers with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and high school volunteers and Lutheran college interns who serve as camp counselors. This program's goals are to instill leadership skills and a passion for ministry to people with IDD within congregations and the church-at-large. The funds for this grant will be used to financially assist Lutheran college students to serve as camp counselor interns. Funds will also be used to defray costs of volunteers who serve at one of Bethesda's camps in Wisconsin, Indiana, and Texas.

MG 109 ~ \$5,000 CHURCHES TO CHILDREN OUTREACH PROJECT

The Churches to Children Outreach Project has been developed by Concordia Gospel Outreach with resource and material support from Concordia Publishing House. This project will equip at least 15 LCMS congregations in the North Dakota District with Gospel -based resources and training materials to share within their communities. The project will work in tandem with existing congregational outreach efforts and will help congregations identify new opportunities for outreach. The funds for this grant will be used to purchase outreach kits tailored to the specific ministry needs of identified congregations as well as the development of brochures with numerous topics to aid families and children.

MG 110 ~ \$2,000 ENGAGING YOUR COMMUNITY: NORTH DAKOTA

LCMS Rural and Small Town Mission (RSTM), based in Concordia, MO, provides training and resources to called and lay leaders throughout the LCMS. The primary focus of RSTM is to support congregations in rural and small-town settings. RSTM partners with Districts to host an "Engaging Your Community" event that focuses on congregational issues specific to rural congregations (e.g., shrinking membership, fewer children and families in worship, etc.). The funds for this grant will be used to provide financial support to host an "Engaging Your Community" event in North Dakota that will be held at no charge to attendees.

MG 111 ~ \$4,320 CHRIST'S CARE FOR CHILDREN: KENYA

Christ's Care for Children: Kenya, a joint child support program of LCMS and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK), assists children at school boarding Project 24 facilities. The program provides the following boarding services: a safe environment, adequate lodging, meals, school fees and related school expenses, medical care, an appropriate play area, adult oversight, scholastic tutoring, emotional support, and spiritual care. The funds from this grant will be used to provide Kenyan children with one year of care including food as well as educational and spiritual support.

MG 112 ~ \$2,500 MARTIN LUTHER SCHOOL—KIDS SHARE CHRIST

Martin Luther School (MLS) is an LCMS-supported school serving families in the Bismarck-Mandan community offering kindergarten through grade 8 Christian education. The MLS Kids Share Christ is a program that allows children to participate in service projects that reach out to the community with a mission emphasis, sharing Christ. The funds for this grant will be used for service projects which could potentially include: building and maintaining a "Little Free Library" in the MLS neighborhood, materials to make and donate fleece blankets to area mission organizations, materials for care packages for the hurting and hungry, and portable speakers for music program outreach.

MG 113 ~ \$5,000 CONFESSIONAL LUTHERAN EDUCATION FOUNDATION E-READER PROJECT

The Confessional Lutheran Education Foundation (CLEF) partners with the LCMS Lutheran Church bodies and seminaries in Africa and Asia to supply seminary students, faculties, and pastors with theological libraries and course materials. The CLEF International Lutheran Electronic Reader Project (ILERP) will provide seminary students, pastors, and professors with periodicals and resources housed on an electronic reader. The funds for this grant will be used to purchase electronic readers (the Amazon Kindle White Paper) as well as provide funding for the initial introductory course for a qualified theological professor.

MG 114 ~ \$1,500 WAHPETON LCMS U

LCMS U is an initiative to connect and support Lutheran students attending college by involving, connecting, and encouraging parents, congregations and campus ministries as they seek to care for students. Immanuel Lutheran Church, Wahpeton, ND, is forming an LCMS U chapter to reach out to students at North Dakota State College of Science. The funds for this grant will be used for chapter start-up costs, Bible study materials, welcoming party supplies, national conferences, and/or mission opportunities.

MG 115 ~ \$4,800 WORSHIP SPACE—EMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH, MADRID, SPAIN

Emmanuel Lutheran Congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Spain located in Madrid is a developing congregation in need of a place of worship. Sites such as employer break rooms and member homes have been used in the past but are inconsistent in availability and are not large enough to accommodate the congregation. Rental space is expensive, but an affordable worship space has been located allowing for establishment of a consistent place of worship. The funds for this grant will be used to pay rent for worship space for Divine Service two times per month for two years.



There are designated times that offerings will be taken at convention and the money has been earmarked to be given to certain causes.

<u>Convention Offering #1</u>—This offering will be collected on Friday night, during the Opening Worship Service. All of the money given will go to Mites to help fund our North Dakota District Projects and the mission projects at the national LWML level.

<u>Convention Offering #2</u>—This offering will be collected on Saturday afternoon, right after hearing Mission Speakers. All of the money given will be donated to the ND Church Starts.

Convention Offering #3—This offering will be collected on Sunday morning, during our Closing Worship. All of the money given at this offering will be donated to Orphan Grain Train, ND Branch.

Do I Have to Be an LWML Member to Attend District Convention and Zone Events?
