Please pray for these people as they attend the convention and represent North Dakota.

Mission Grant VP ~ BONNIE KRENZ



Two grants have already been funded. Praises to Lord for the generous mite offerings from our LWML members! The first portion of the District Scholarship Fund has been sent leaving \$28,000 to be funded. The Wahpeton LCMS U project has been completed funded. LCMS U is an initiative to connect and support Lutheran students attending college by involving, connecting, and encouraging parents, congregations and campus ministries as they seek to care for students. Immanuel Lutheran Church, Wahpeton, ND, is forming an LCMS U chapter to reach out to students at North Dakota State College of Science. The funds for this grant will be used for chapter start-up costs, Bible study materials, welcoming party supplies, national conferences, and/or mission opportunities.

At the November Board Meeting the following projects were approved to be funded when mites are available.

- District Scholarship fund \$7,000 The North Dakota Church Worker Scholarship is a program administered by the North Dakota District LCMS for youth and adults who desire to be educated and become full time workers in God's kingdom in the LCMS.
- Orphan Grain Train \$4,500 The funds for this grant will be used for various expenses including: building updates, heat, electricity, and insurance for the Jamestown warehouse; gas, license, and insurance for the OGT van; and shipping costs for containers of donated goods.
- Christ the Way \$2,500 The funds from this grant will be used to pay for production and broadcast costs of this
 radio ministry and provide stabilization of funds for future endeavors and potential rate increases

Please remember these three projects in your prayers.

LWML ND DISTRICT MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS NEEDED

The Mission Grants Committee is looking for mission projects to be considered for the 2018-20 Biennium. If you know of a worthy project, please submit an application following these guidelines:

Mission grant proposals shall be submitted in resolution form to the Vice President of Mission Grants at least six (6) months prior to the District convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML members, societies, units, zones and LCMS Boards. (Bylaws Article XV, Section1)

Ministries seeking funding should:

- be mission in emphasis, extending the ministry of the Word;
- fit into the plans and projections of the LCMS;
- be current and ready for implementation;
- Be on-going in nature, continuing after the grant money has been expended.

WRITING THE PROPOSAL

- Prepare the cover sheet of your mission grant proposal, including the following items:
- Name of grant or mission project
- Location of project
- Amount requested
- Name and address of person submitting proposal
- Name and address information of the person within the project to whom the funds will be sent.

Prepare a separate detailed information paper (single-sided, single-spaced, maximum length 2 pages) about the ministry. The information should include:

- ► Project goal
- ▶ Purpose for which funds will be used
- ▶ Budget and cost information
- ► How does your program differ, broaden or support?
- ► Long term maintenance & sustainability
- ▶ Other comments or information.

- ▶ Needs
- ► Tentative date funds will be used
- ► Are there similar existing programs in your area? What? Where?
- ► Staff description: Who? How many? Qualifications?
- ► Additional reasons you feel this project is important

Prepare a proposal in resolution form. Be concise and specific. Start with a purpose/goal statement. Include ministry needs, amount of funds requested and purpose for which the money will be used.

(Example)

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has instructed parents to bring up their children in the way of the Lord and has asked that little children be brought to Him; and

WHEREAS, JC Christian School is a necessary mission field in a new neighborhood and has already drawn new members to the LCMS church: and

WHEREAS, Bible-based materials vastly expand the Christian knowledge of our children; and

WHEREAS, up-to-date video equipment enhances learning capabilities;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Wahpeton, ND in June 2014 grant \$5,000 to JC Christian School for the purchase of audio-visual equipment and new Bible-based textbooks.

Prepare 2-4 photos to be included with the proposal, either on a CD or to be sent electronically.

- Choose pictures that best illustrate your grant and communicate your mission.
- Write a short description for each photo.

The grant proposal must be submitted by September 30, 2017 to the Vice President of Mission Grants either as an email attachment with photos to missiongrants@ndlwml.org OR 6 copies and a CD of photos mailed to Bonnie Krenz, 9920 Main St. Binford, ND, 58416.

After recommendation by the Mission Grants Committee, approval for ballot by the ND LWML Board of Directors and vote by the delegates in convention in June 2018, you will be contacted by July 1, 2018 as to whether or not your mission project has been chosen for funding.

God bless you as you continue in His Word & work!
