The Parliamentarian is also a member of the Bylaws committee. We have finished reviewing the District Bylaws. I would like to share a point that is found in both the National and District bylaws that may have some units looking at their bylaws. As the membership declines in congregations in the rural parts of North Dakota so does the membership in LWML societies established in those congregations. According to the National and District LWML Bylaws, any woman who is a member of an LCMS congregation can join a society. If an individual request, she can become an individual member. An individual member does have a voice and the right to vote at the zone level but cannot vote at the District level. Each unit may wish to check their bylaws to determine if their unit would allow an LWML member from a sister congregation to join their unit.



MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

2018—2020

MG 1801 ~ \$35,000 ND DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

GOAL: To aid ND students with the financial costs associated with attending schools, colleges and seminaries in order that they may train to become full-time church workers.

NEED: The need for full-time church workers is great as we strive to follow our Lord's command to spread the Good News of Jesus' love to the world. The cost of education continues to escalate and is often a burden for those who desire to serve the Lord.

WHEREAS, North Dakota youth and adults who desire to be educated and become full-time workers in God's kingdom in the LCMS should be encouraged and aided as they train to serve the Lord; and

WHEREAS, Christ, in His Holy Word has commanded us to go into all the world to teach and proclaim His message of salvation; and

WHEREAS, the cost of higher education continues to escalate and become a burden for those students; and

WHEREAS, the students who will benefit from these scholarships are members (or were at the time of their initial scholarship application) of North Dakota LCMS congregations;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the ND District LWML in convention in the year 2018 grant \$35,000 to be used in this financial aid program for students pursuing full-time church work vocations at an LCMS college, university or seminary in collaboration with the ND District LCMS.

MG 1803 ~ \$7,500 CHRIST'S CARE FOR CHILDREN KENYA/ PROJECT 24

GOAL: To provide for the continued growth, care, and support of orphaned children in Kenya who reside at one of several Chris-centered child boarding facilities constructed through Project 24.

NEED: The funds from this grant will be used to provide Kenyan children with one year of care including food as well as educational and spiritual support. The cost to sponsor a child for one month is roughly \$90.00.

WHEREAS, Matthew 25:40 assures us that whenever and wherever we serve the "least of these brothers and sister" of Christ, we are serving the Lord; and WHEREAS, the orphaned, neglected, and abandoned children in Kenya having no means, guidance nor help for success are clearly the "least of these;" and

WHEREAS, Project 24 is seeking assistance for the continued service and support to the children at their rescue centers through the Christ's Care for Children – Kenya program; and

WHEREAS, Psalms 133 recounts how good and pleasing it is when brothers live together in harmony for the sake of God's blessings; and

WHEREAS, the North Dakota District – LCMS and the Minnesota North District – LCMS are already in partnership together and with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Kenya to help with Project 24 and the children it serves; and

WHEREAS, this partnership has the opportunity to augment and expand its efforts through the Christ's Care for Children – Kenya as the program stated by ELCK to assist the work of Project 24 in providing for the ongoing needs of children in the rescue centers; and

WHEREAS, the sum of \$7500 will provide sponsorship of food, shelter, education, clothing, and all other living expenses for children;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Minot, ND in June 2018 grant \$7500 to Christ's Care for Children Kenya/Project 24 ND District – LCMS for purpose of the ND District, MN North District, and ELCK dwelling together in harmony by providing service and care to the "least of these" children of God in the Project 24 Rescue centers.

MG 1804 ~ \$7,500 ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN

GOAL: To provide food, clothing, medical assistance, and the true Word of God to those in need at home who have suffered losses via natural disasters and also provide aid to destitute people of the world, NEED: The funds for this grant will be used for shipping costs for containers of donated goods. The average cost to sponsor a shipment is \$9000.

WHEREAS, in Psalm 68:10b "in your goodness, O God, you provided for the needy;" and WHEREAS, the Orphan Grain Train has been in

whereas, the Orphan Grain Train has been in operation for over 25 years and is expanding its number of branches with millions of hours of volunteer service; and

WHEREAS, the Orphan Grain Train is meeting the needs of destitute people in Russia, Latvia, Liberia, Mexico and other countries around the world as well as hurricane, floor, tornado and fire victims across the United States; and

WHEREAS the Orphan Grain Train continue its efforts by giving of food, clothing, medical supplies

and God's Word to those in need; and

WHEREAS, the cost to make a shipment is in the thousands of dollars;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, to give thanks to God for the Grain Train volunteers and grant the organization \$7500 to assist with expenses to continue their work.

MG 1805 ~ \$5,000 MERCY MEALS—ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN

GOAL: The desire to ease the burden of hunger for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are in need by showing the love of Christ in the preparation of nutritious and low-cost meals and to bring the joy and privilege of service for others to our neighbors by providing them with the opportunity to demonstrate Christ-like love through volunteering.

NEED: to purchase supplies for packing events (specifically for groups with minimal funding available) and transportation costs to travel to and from event sites over the 2018-2020 biennium. Some funds would also be used for equipment upgrade and replacement, and various office supply costs.

WHEREAS, we are encouraged by our Lord to care for others in need (Matthew 22:39, Luke 10:25-37, John 21:15-17); and

WHEREAS, we are encouraged by the apostles to be eager to serve and demonstrate love by serving one another (Romans 12:10-13, Galatians 5:13-14, Ephesians 6:7, 1 Peter 4:10-11, 1 Peter 5:2); and WHEREAS, when we show love and kindness in service to others, we are serving God with our gifts and bringing glory to Him (Matthew 25:40, 1 Peter 4:11, 2 Corinthians 9:12); and

WHEREAS, Mercy Meals of North Dakota provides the opportunity for people to live out their faith by serving God and their neighbor, and in doing so, provide food for those who are hungry;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$5,000 to Mercy Meals of North Dakota for the purchase of supplies and equipment, and transportation costs in order to carry out their mission.

MG 1806 ~ \$5,000 GRACE LUTHERAN SCHOOL

GOAL: To increase the ability of families in our community to receive tuition assistance and have the ability to send their children to our school where they learn the faith and love that Jesus Christ offers to us.

NEED: Funds to help grow our scholarship fund availability in order to include more families of need.

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has instructed parents to bring up their children in the way of the Lord and has asked that little children be brought to Him; and

WHEREAS, Grace Lutheran School is a necessary mission field in the Fargo-Moorhead community to help spread the word of Jesus Christ and the beliefs of the LCMS and is actively working to draw new members to the LCMS church through our outreach to these families; and

WHEREAS, scholarship availability increases the chances of some families' ability to attend our LCMS mission school; and

WHEREAS, scholarship Funds are needed to continue our evangelism mission into the Fargo-Moorhead community;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$5,000 to Grace Lutheran School for the ability to offer more families tuition assistance.

MG 1807 ~ \$5,000 "CHRIST THE WAY" RADIO MINISTRY

GOAL: To spread the Word of God via this radio ministry started in 1929 in Fargo, ND and now located in Jamestown, ND.

NEED: The funds from this grant will be used to pay for production and broadcast costs of this radio ministry and provide stabilization of funds for future endeavors and potential rate increases. The cost per each 15 minute Sunday programs is approximately \$69.00.

WHEREAS, "Christ the Way" radio program has shared the gospel of Jesus Christ with many people in several Midwestern states since 1929; and "Christ the Way" is truly a ND District WHEREAS, - LCMS radio ministry as the messages are recorded by LCMS pastors of the ND District; and WHEREAS, "Christ the Way" has no endowment fund to support the cost of its programs but must rely on the donations of individuals and other organizations if its ministry is to continue into the future; that the ND THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED District LWML in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$5000.00 to support the Gospel ministry of "Christ the Way" radio program.

MG 1808 ~ \$10,000 MAIN STREET LIVING

GOAL: The goal is to provide a faithful-to-Scripture message of Jesus Christ to a large number of people through the mediums of TV broadcast and the Internet; especially to the home bound, assisted-living and nursing homes, as well as to the entire

"mission field" of all individuals who are at their homes on Sunday mornings and/or who have access to the Internet. While there are other religious programs being broadcast on TV, these programs are led by our own LCMS pastors!

NEED: The newly launched TV ministry covering approximately the eastern half of North Dakota and western half of northern Minnesota. The primary financial needs for this project include the purchasing of TV air time currently \$925/week plus the cost of updating recording and editing equipment.

WHEREAS, Holy Scripture informs us that: "Faith comes by hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ." Romans 10:17; and WHEREAS, the newly launched (January 1, 2017), locally produced "Main Street Living North" TV program features a distinctively LCMS 30-minute weekly worship service led by a rotating schedule of pastors of the ND & MN North Districts of the LCMS, and includes hymns locally recorded by our own Main Street Living Choir, plus a 30 minute Sunday School style children's program called "Kid's Crossing" which uses our Synod's own Concordia Publishing House materials; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Living North program is specifically designed for the home bound, assisted-living and nursing homes, as well as the "mission field" of all other individuals who are at their homes on Sunday mornings and/or who have access to the Internet; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$10,000, which would cover nearly 11 Sundays of purchasing TV air time, to Main Street Living North to assist them in presenting a quality evangelistic television ministry that invites the unchurched and shut-ins to better know the saving grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

MG 1810 ~ \$5,000 VALLEY LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL—CEDAR RAPIDS, IA

GOAL: To raise funds for the tuition scholarship fund for Valley Lutheran High School, Cedar Falls, IA. NEED: Valley Lutheran High School exists to assist parent in educating their young adults in the ways of the Lord. In the past three school years eight young adults expressed their love for God be being baptized and/or confirmed. Sixty-six percent of the student body is non LCMS Lutherans. As funds become available more students can be assisted. No student receives a full scholarship as the school's philosophy is if they pay a portion they will be more involved in their education.

WHEREAS, the Bible states we are to "Train up a child in the way he should go"; and

MG 1812 ~ \$5,000 DAKOTA BOYS AND GIRLS RANCH

GOAL: To enhance successful treatment of at-risk children at the Ranch by providing Christian education, one-on-one spiritual life support and group sessions, chapel services and baptismal Services to the children, families and staff at Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch.

NEED: ND LWML funds will be used to support spiritual life programming to children at the Ranch. WHEREAS, Proverbs 22:6 states, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it:" and

WHEREAS, Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch is an essential Christian psychiatric and residential treatment center in North Dakota with a mission to help at-risk children and their families succeed in the name of Christ; and

WHEREAS, each day, the Ranch serves up to 140 children through a holistic model of care where our ministry's success in serving at-risk children and families is attributed in great part to our Spiritual Life Program, which is not provided by secular agencies; and

WHEREAS, children find hope and healing through Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch's focus on faith; and

WHEREAS, spiritual nurturing is a key part of the Ranch's ministry and mission to help kids overcome their challenges and the trauma they have experi-

enced in their young lives; and

WHEREAS, studies show that religious beliefs and practices decrease stress and are beneficial to mental health and that addressing spiritual needs in treatment allows the whole person to heal; and

WHEREAS, proper educational approaches and techniques will provide youth and families a chance to find the strength, hope and support to overcome their challenges; and

the Ranch will continue to meet the WHEREAS, spiritual needs of children in our care and enhance successful treatment in His name by providing; a spiritual assessment upon each child's arrival at the Ranch, a Bible and other Christian resources to introduce children to Jesus and help them grow in their faith, weekly chapel services with worship and teaching from God's Word, weekly Spiritual Life groups, a Christian environment, retreats and celebrations, ongoing Spiritual mentoring by our Chaplain and Spiritual Life Specialists, a daily devotion for Ranch employees, spiritual mentoring and guidance for employees; and THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the ND District Lutheran Women's Missionary League in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$5,000 to the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch Foundation to help provide a Spiritual Life Program to at-risk children across the state of North Dakota.

MG 1818 ~ \$2,500 ST. ANDREW'S MISSION SOCIETY BUS PROJECT

GOAL: The St Andrew Mission Society purpose is to spread the Gospel message through servant work. NEED: The wrap on the bus is faded, worn and looks shabby. The purchasing and installing a new wrap for bus giving a Christian message to all who view it. WHEREAS, in God's Holy Word we are encouraged to not be ashamed to testify about our Lord, and Jesus instructed His disciples to be His witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth; and

WHEREAS, the St. Andrew Mission Society bus annually travels across the United States; and WHEREAS, the St. Andrew Mission Society bus is used by our youth as transportation to events; and WHEREAS, the St. Andrew Mission Society bus is a witness every day to the people in West Fargo; and WHEREAS, the message on the bus is a witness to all who view it;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Dakota District Lutheran Women's Missionary League in convention in Minot, North Dakota on June 22-24, 2018 grant \$2500 to the St. Andrew Mission Society for the purpose of purchasing and installing a new wrap for the bus, giving a Christian message to all who view it.

MG 1821 ~ \$2,250 CHINESE RESOURCES FOR CAMPUS MINISTRIES

GOAL: To extend the ministry of the Word by translating and publishing Lutheran books that help explain the Bible, including *Luther's Small Catechism*, *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories*, hymnals and providing the resources so desperately needed by churches and missionaries around the world.

NEED: LCMS campus ministries at the University of North Dakota and North Dakota State University have been blessed to have international students arrive on their doorsteps, wanting to know more about the Christian faith. The gift of a book in their own language is priceless for international students, and it opens doors to conversations about who God is

WHEREAS, the Holy Spirit at Pentecost gave Jesus' disciples the gift of speaking in many tongues, so that all God's children might hear His call (Acts 2:1-41); and

WHEREAS, the United States continues to welcome immigrants and students from every corner of the world, including over 1,300 Chinese immigrants and international students in the North Dakota District; and

WHEREAS, LCMS campus ministries at North Dakota State University and University of North Dakota have established outreach to Chinese students to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with them and the Lutheran campus pastors of North Dakota have expressed a deep need for Lutheran books in the Chinese languages; and

Expenses such as the printing and mailing of the newsletter and the cost associated with the website. District officers may submit a voucher for mileage to attend meetings, postage, meals, and other costs associated with serving you through being a District Officer.
