LWML ND DISTRICT PRAYER CHAIN


President Valerie sent out these prayer requests she received via email, for Jan 2018—March 2018:

The LWML is near and dear to my heart and God has blessed me with so many totally awesome mentors and friends through the LWML. I am concerned though. Not new concerns but concerns many others share within our beloved organization. There are also some points we, once again, need to clarify. I know you know these points but sometimes we need to bring them to the forefront and refresh ourselves. What I am getting at is Mites, Mission Grants Goals, Mite Goals.

<u>Mites:</u> dollars sent with joyful hearts to expand the kingdom of our Lord and Savior, here at home and throughout the world.

<u>Mission Grants Goal</u>: a dollar amount to fund specific projects selected by the voting delegates at the LWML ND District Convention.

A <u>Mite Goal</u> is not something we deal with but need to be aware of -- this is the amount of mites we need to gather to fund our mission grants goal, send mites to National and run the ND District operations. ND District operations are everyday costs to handle mailings, meetings, printing.......Dollars needed to make sure everything gets done.

So the financial formula is Mission Grants Goal plus National Mites plus Operating costs equals what we need to gather for mites: Mite Goal. FYI: National Mites are determined by the amount of mites we receive. National receives 25% of all mites we gather in our District.

This is not a gloom and doom / or hope you feel guilty message. Just a heads up as to what is slowly happening with in our own ND District. Bonnie Krenz, VP of Mission Grants, is valiantly trying to keep us all abreast of the Mission Grant payments or outflows. When she was elected the ND District was at a deficit point, meaning – we were using mite dollars from the current biennium to fund Mission Grants from the previous biennium. (Sort of like Deficit spending.) This is something we cannot continue to do. I am unsure how to solve the situation and welcome your suggestions. We need to sit back and challenge ourselves and our units to become active in faithfully sending in our mites and, when possible, increase by any "mite" you can. We also need to look at the Mission Grants and utilize our mites the best way possible.

Lutheran Ladies – <u>yes</u> we make lunch --- <u>but</u> it is our MITES that make a huge DIFFERENCE bringing the Good News of Salvation to the world.

Once again the formula is:

Mission Grants Goal

- + Mites sent to National (25% of mites submitted to the ND District)
- + Operating Expenses
- = MITES NEEDED TO FUND THE BIENNIUM (Mite Goal)

I look forward to meeting you as you drop off your ingathering items and take part in one of the servant events. I have found that when I take part in a servant event it puts me in the right frame of mind for the rest of the convention. It's a great way to

catch up with old friends or make new ones while participating in an activity that serves and benefits others!

Ingathering Event - There is still time to set up a collection point so your congregation can participate in bringing items for the ingathering collection. (For specific items see the following pages.) Let your imagination soar in creating a collection point for the ingathering items! IDEAS: For the Baby Boutique it can be as simple as a baby blanket draped over the side of a large box, to borrowing a baby's travel bed that only takes moments to assemble. For the Domestic Violence Crisis Center think spring and simply wrap a large collection box in colorful wrapping paper. For the Dakota Boys

and Girl's Ranch items get your youth on board for both decorating a collection point and shopping for items.

<u>Servant Events</u> – You can choose from putting together Mercy Meals, packing honey, folding newsletters at St. Mark's Lutheran Church or packing the ingathering items at the Holiday Inn. You can mix and match the events as well. It will be a fulfilling way to spend your Friday afternoon!

Finally, I am excited to hear from your units on whether you took the <u>Missions in Motion</u> challenge that I detailed in the last Messenger. This is replacing the regular Missions in Motion walk that is usually done during the convention. It is so easy to do, and you can involve your congregation too! Simply challenge 30 families/individuals (whatever number works for you) to give a \$1 a day for 30 days = a total gift of \$30. Have them deposit their gift within an envelope they can just drop into your large mite box!



What is LWML about? LWML is more than just coffee pots and church lunches.


- * IT'S ABOUT being with Jesus.
