At the 2018 Minot Convention the delegates approved the mission grant budget of \$76,500 with the mission projects listed below. Please remember them in your prayers. The following projects were also on the ballot but were not voted to be funded. Please remember them in your prayers that their work may continue and find funding from other sources. If your unit at Christmas or other times during the year gives gifts please remember the needs of these projects that were not funded. If you need more information about any of these project, please contact me.

MG 1821 Chinese Resources for Campus Ministries \$2.250 The Lutheran Heritage Foundation has translated and published several very useful Lutheran books in the Chinese languages that are widely used in North Dakota's campus ministries. LCMS campus ministries at NDSU and UND have established outreach to Chinese students to introduce them to the love of Jesus. However, a great challenge remains: Often the Chinese students aren't fluent in English, and the pastors and evangelism teams don't speak Chinese. With the help of the LWML, over 800 books will be provides by LHF for Chinese campus ministry outreach here in North Dakota and giving them the resources they need to share the Good News with their Chinese students in a language they can easily read and understand.

MG 1806 Grace Lutheran School Scholarship Fund - \$5,000 The grant will increase the ability of families in our community to receive tuition assistance and have the ability to send their children to Grace School where they learn the faith and love that Jesus Christ offers. Grace School is the only LCMS school in Fargo-Moorhead and is supported by six LCMS churches. Grace has been in operation for over 68 years. The grant will be used to help with the growing financial strain of young millennial families and to help bring new families into the LCMS faith by removing financial barriers through the offering of scholarships.

MG 1807 Christ the Way Radio Ministry - \$5,000 "Christ the Way" radio program has been on the air in North Dakota since 1929. The program was originally called "The Way" when it aired from Fargo. The name changed when the radio program moved to Jamestown in 1986. Pastor Eckstein recruits pastors of the ND District to record programs which they email to Pastor Eckstein. He then burns their messages to CD which Philip Cherney delivers to the radio station. Cherney sets up the program by adding opening and closing comments along with music selections. The funds will be used to pay for production and broadcast costs of this radio ministry and provide stabilization of funds for future endeavors and potential rate increases. The cost per each 15 minute Sunday program is approximately \$69.00

MG 1810 Valley Lutheran High School Scholarship Fund, Cedar Falls, IA \$5,000 By the Grace of God, Valley Lutheran School strives to inspire students by strengthening faith in Christ, pursuing academic excellence, and preparing hearts for service. Families choose Valley as an alternative to public education, as they educate children, not only academically and emotionally, but also spiritually through the love of Jesus Christ. The student body is 33% LCMS members. In the past three years 8 young adults have expressed their love for God by being baptized and/or confirmed. No student receives a full scholarship as the high school's philosophy is if they pay a portion they will be more involved in their education. Tuition for one student is \$5475 per year. The tuition does not cover the cost of a student's education so the high school relies on the support of area churches, donations and fundraisers. A grant from the LWML would help to offer scholarships to families in need of financial support.

The 2018 Minot Convention delegates approved many bylaw changes. Most of the changes were simply to bring the North Dakota District LWML bylaws in alignment with National LWML bylaws. There was one change to the ND District LWML bylaws. The new bylaw defines who can be an individual member, how to become an individual member, and what privileges are and aren't available to an individual member. An individual member can express a view, vote, and be elected to an office at the zone level. An individual member cannot serve as a delegate to and cannot vote at either the District or National conventions. This is because an individual member only represents herself, whereas, a member of a society represents a group of members. The individual member can be appointed to a district committee and elected to a district office. As an elected district officer an individual member can vote at the district convention, as she is representing all the members of the ND LWML district who elected her to the office. The District Bylaws should be updated and posted to the website by the end of September.
