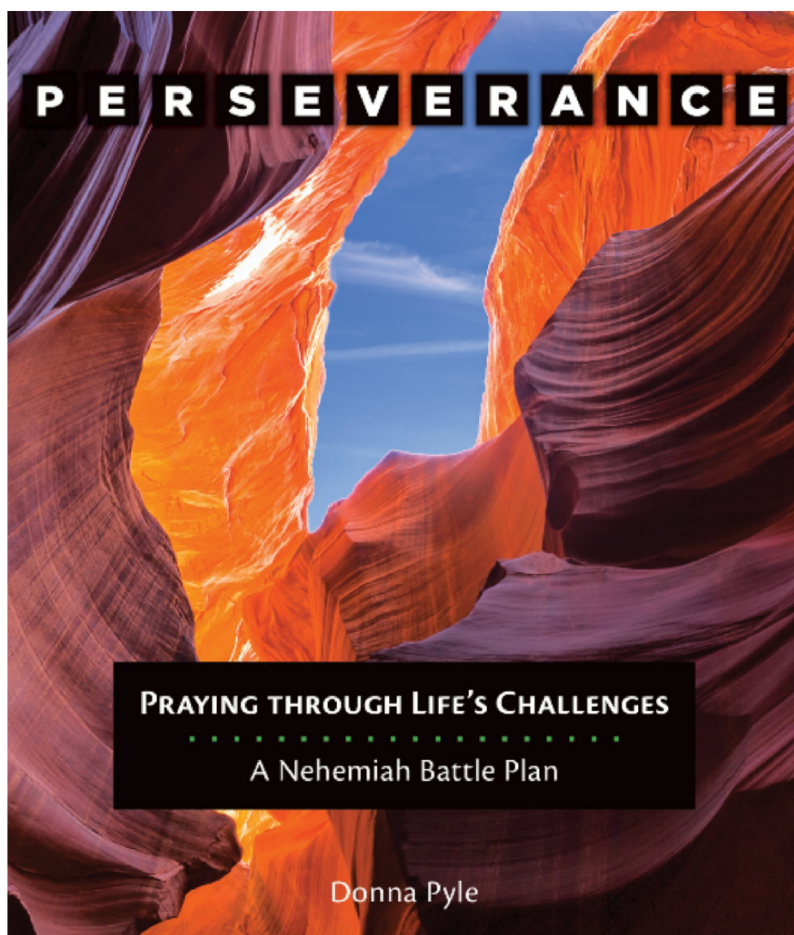

"GROWING SEASON"



As I am writing this article it is late May and we are still in the Easter season. Soon we will celebrate Pentecost and Trinity Sunday. The church year is divided into various seasons. Every season is, of course, focused on our Lord Jesus. For part of the year we look at Jesus' life here on earth - his birth, death, resurrection and ascension. For the other part of the year, the one we are now entering, the church focuses on our growth in Jesus.

The season of Pentecost stretches from Trinity Sunday (this year on June 16) through the last Sunday of the church year (this year on November 24). Green paraments are used on the altar during this season and some have called it the season of the "green meadow" probably because these Sundays emphasize our

need to grow and mature as disciples of Jesus. Of course, we should be growing and maturing in our love and service to God all the time, but this time of the year in the church is when it is emphasized. 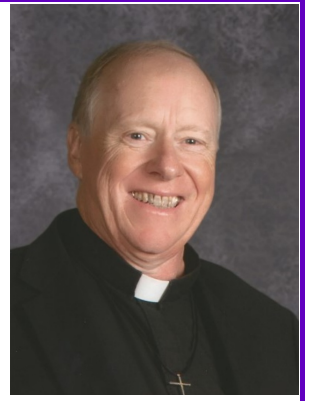
"Are You a 'Son-kissed Lemon'?"

A number of years ago there were some advertisements on the TV, radio and in many magazines about Sunkist fruit. The Sunkist Company prided themselves in the fact that their fruit had that special touch of the sun which made their fruit the best fruit around. One of these advertisements read: "Sunkist lemons turn the trick." Many people may disagree with this advertisement. No matter what they think, lemons still leave a sour taste in their mouths! No matter how much warmth of the sun you pour out on a lemon it still doesn't have much appeal to them.

However, when I read the words of Psalm 2:12 the Sunkist lemon took on a new meaning for me. It says: *Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and you perish in the way, for His wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in Him.* This verse made me think about myself as a "Son-kissed lemon." Besides the fact that lemons may leave a sour taste in our mouths, we also refer to lemons in other negative ways. One example is when we refer to a car as being "a lemon" because everything seems to be going wrong with it.

In one sense we are like lemons also because of our sinfulness. The devil uses the sinful world around us as kind of a catalyst for our sinful natures. When we are tempted we may give in to doing things in our lives which go against God's Word because of our sinfulness. Whenever we fall into sin it also leaves a "sour taste" in the form of a guilty conscience. So much of the time we see the "lemon" aspects of our lives—our failures, our insecurities, our lack of faith, our hatred and contempt for others and a host of other sins. The worst part of our lemon-like quality is when it makes us undesirable to God. Isaiah 59:2 says: *Your iniquities have made a separation between*

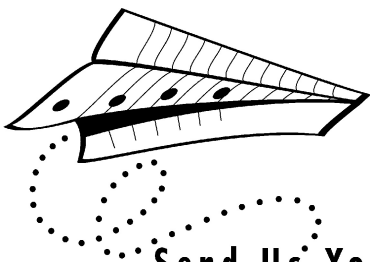


you and your God, and your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear. It's kind of like "leaving a sour taste in God's mouth."

This is why it is so important for you to "kiss the Son" as the psalm says. Jesus came into a world full of lemons—sinners—and loved you so much that He died for your sins! Romans 5:8 says that the action of this Son was God's love directed toward us sinners—*God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.* It was this action of Jesus that has brought you into a loving, peaceful, pleasing relationship with God—not a relationship where God is turned away from you in His wrath.

It is this work of Jesus for you—His having "kissed" you with His grace—which moves you to "kiss the Son" by *taking refuge in Jesus*. When you see those lemon-like qualities showing forth in your life in sin, the Holy Spirit moves you to "kiss the Son" by partaking of His means of grace to receive His forgiveness anew. Under this forgiveness of God in Jesus Christ, His Son, you experience His blessing and can live a new life as God's own "Son-kissed lemon!"

New Mite Box Unveiled



During the Friday afternoon session at the 2019 LWML Convention in Mobile, the newly designed, by Amy Gill, Mite Box was presented in a video produced by Eva Koeller. The Mite Box design has changed over the years since 1942 in which over 100 million dollars has been prayerfully given to fund grants with the unchanging mission — reaching out to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Each attendee at the convention received a new Mite Box.

LWML Sets 2019–2021 Mission Goal at \$2.1 Million

ST. LOUIS, June 24, 2019 — The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) welcomed 3104 people with 691 as first timers to the LWML Convention in Mobile, Alabama, June 20–23, 2019, under the theme "In Praise to the LORD!" The convention theme was based on 1 Chronicles 16:23–24a.

Delegates to the 38th Biennial Convention of the LWML adopted a \$2,100,000 mission goal for the 2019–2021 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 21 mission grants as men and women respond in prayer and offerings during the next two years. LWML chose to support the following mission grants, pledging their support with prayers and mites (offerings) given over the next biennium:

10. Ministry in Motion at Trinity in Mobile, AL, \$58,000
11. Touching the Living Word (LBW), \$100,000
12. Women's Witness and Mercy Asia — Mission Central, \$100,000
13. Digital Media Development (LFL), 30,000
14. Hope and Healing Hub of Downtown Lincoln, NE, \$50,000
