This last summer I participated in an online Bible study led by Sharla Fritz based on her book *Enough for Now*. Sharla is a Christian author, speaker, musician and retreat leader. Her book is published by Concordia Publishing House. I heartily recommend her book to you.

So my question to you is "what is enough?" Do you have enough money, food, clothes to meet your needs? What about your wants? Our wants or desires are where this Bible study written by Sharla has its focus. As my husband and I get nearer to retirement, we look around our house and say, "Do we really want to move all this stuff; do we need all this stuff when we retire and supposedly downsize?" My husband and I have lived in Carrington now for 18 years. That is

way longer than I have ever lived in one place before. So what happens when you live in the same place a long time? You collect stuff. Do we need all this stuff? Not really. But you can get so comfortable just having this stuff sitting around. A definition of enough is "occurring in such quantity, quality, or scope as to fully satisfy demands or needs". Is this your definition? But, more importantly, what does God say about having enough? Does your definition line up with His?

This is where Sharla's book comes in. She takes her reader on a journey to find out God's answer to the question of enough. She shows how our desires for more stuff can drive us to God rather than to more money, more stuff, more activity. God desires for us to find our "enough" in Him rather than in the transient things of this life. Luke 12:34 says For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. Where is your treasure? I pray that it is in Jesus who gave Himself up for you on the cross of Calvary. We will soon be heading into the part of the church year that concentrates on the life of Jesus beginning with His birth in Bethlehem and leading to His death, resurrection and ascension. Jesus is our "enough". He is our treasure!

As we turn the corner into the new year of 2020, please make plans now to celebrate the treasure we have in Jesus at the LWML ND District convention which will be on June 26-28 in Fargo. Faith Comes by Hearing

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved," (Romans 8:9). This has led many to say of their neighbors, friends, and family, who no longer attend Church services, "They believe in God." In fact, someone has said to me, "Pastor, I don't have to go to Church to be saved. Faith is a matter of the heart." This is very well true. Paul continued, "with the heart one believes and is justified." But the faith isn't only a matter of the heart. Paul also said, "with the mouth one confesses and is saved."

Faith is a matter of both the heart and the mouth. After all, Paul told us, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." But then he asked the pertinent questions. "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed?" Obviously, you can't and won't call on help that you either don't believe exists or don't believe will be of any help. "And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard?" If you've never heard of Jesus, you can't believe in Him to call on Him. "And how are they to hear without someone preaching?" Jesus was born in our flesh. He bore our sins as He died on the cross. Three days later, He was raised from the dead. Forty days later, He ascended into heaven and even now is seated at the right hand of

the throne of God. Now, in these days, He speaks through the men, whom He sends. Here's the point: inspired by the Holy Spirit, Paul told us that we believe in God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—because we have heard the truth from the preachers sent by Him.

"Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ," (Romans 10:17). If you have never heard the Word of God, you cannot have faith. Get yourself to where you can hear your pastor read the Word and preach it. If you can't, call your pastor and have him come to you. Encourage and invite your family, friends, and neighbors to hear this same Word of God, which instills faith, so that they too may hear, believe, confess, and be saved.

Thank you is the theme for my article this quarter. My first thank you is for all the mites that have been given this biennium. The following grants still need to be paid:

- \$14,000 for the Full-time Church Workers Scholarship fund
- \$2,500 for the St. Andrew's Mission Society Bus Project. This project is on hold until the Society can decide the future of the bus.
- \$7,000 for Main Street Living,
- \$5,000 for Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch
- \$625 for Martin Luther School Scholarship Fund
- \$625 for Immanuel Lutheran Church Child Care Center

The mission grants need to be paid by April 30,2020 according to the ND LWML District standing rules.



Please continue your prayers for the mission projects. The next thank you is to all who submitted mission grant applications. Now I am asking for your prayers as the Mission Grant Committee reviews the submissions and selects those to present to the District Board at the November BOD meeting. Another thank you is to each of you that made it possible for me to attend the National Convention in Mobile in June. As with most conventions, there were mission speakers, wonderful Bible studies, information about mission projects, and special evening entertainment. My final thank you is to the Lord who has been by my side and my guide as I have moved through my term as Vice President of Mission Grant. I am excited to complete my term this June.
