CONVENTION CANCELLED

After a lot of prayer and discussion the LWML ND District Board of Directors voted to cancel our face to face convention which would have been on June 26–28, 2020 at the Delta Hotel in Fargo. As you can imagine, this was a very difficult decision to make and certainly unprecedented. It was felt that with the uncertainty concerning the COVID-19 pandemic, not going ahead with our convention was the best and safest course of action to take. For anyone who had already turned in their registration and payment to Registrar Bonnie Kittleson, your money will be returned to you. If perhaps you had made room reservations at the Delta or elsewhere, please remember to cancel those also.

Even though we will not be meeting together in convention, the work of our Lord goes on. We will be voting for our mission goal, mission grants and officers for the 2020-2022 biennium by mail. Ballots will be sent out to all the churches of the LWML ND District. Each unit can have 2 delegates voting. Inside the packet will be information about the voting procedure, 2 ballots with a return envelope which will be sent to Recording Secretary Louise Tegtmeier. Voting information and ballots will be sent out by mail on June 26. They must be postmarked by July 17 to be counted. It will not be necessary to send in the delegate form that was sent to units earlier. Louise and the tellers will keep track of who has voted. Results will be shared on or about August 1.

Right now the plan is to have a transition meeting on August 22 with both outgoing and incoming officers. Then during the district retreat on September 18 and 19, 2020 in Jamestown we will have a "celebration" with worship service, Bible study and installation of new officers. There will be more information on that forthcoming. We will be working on getting you all the information especially from National that would usually be share at convention.

This is a difficult and challenging time for everyone. But remember we are God's people and that has not changed. God has not changed. He is with all of us, all the time. What a blessing that is! I began this article quoting from Isaiah 41:10. I happened on this verse and when I read it I feel what I have known and continue to know about our God. He will continue to be with us, to strengthen us, to help us and to uphold us. He will not leave us; He does not change. What a blessing to know this in our world now that is constantly changing and getting more and more confusing.



Lutheran Women's Missionary League or LWML. Much like the Automated Teller Machine (ATM) we use this title and abbreviation so frequently that it just rolls off the tongue without a thought to the meaning. And it's no wonder! The LWML has been around in an official capacity since 1942 and unofficially you women have been meeting together in auxiliary capacities since the inception of the LC–MS—and dare I say since that first easter morning when the Marys went to care for our Lord's body. That being said, what does it mean that you are in the LWML? What does the LWML mean? We'll start with the last L and work our way backward.

Why do you love and care for those you don't even know? Because you're the Lutheran Women's Missionary League—the LWML. God be praised.
