What happens when one is “cross-eyed?” You see double and it is difficult to distinguish which “picture” in front of you is real. We used to make cross-eyes at each other as children when playing or trying to make someone laugh. I thought that people who were born cross-eyed must have great challenges with each step — how did they know which step was a step in the right direction?

As I ponder our theme for the June convention, “Cross-Eyed ... Focused on Jesus,” I discovered that, on average, the human eye receives 10 million bits of information per second — as fast as an ethernet connection and measured by electrical impulses and pattern spikes. However, the eye can only process about 30 (and up to 60) frames per second — the rate it receives when you’re watching a movie.



When we become “Cross-Eyed” for Jesus, we need no corrective lenses to sort the information around us ... for we are looking at Perfect Love. Jesus’ eyes were always focused His Father in Heaven, and we are only called to follow His example — cross-eyed, with glasses or with eyes that can no longer focus on the outside world.

Several opportunities to serve will be offered at convention, and whether it is creating meals for others, filling backpacks with school supplies or raising mites for mission at your local congregations, we invite you to be completely “Cross-Eyed for Jesus” — all 30–60 frames per second — with pictures of love in your hearts for how you can serve with your hands and feet. If you would like ideas about how to get started or care for others in your congregations, please reach out. I serve because He loves me.

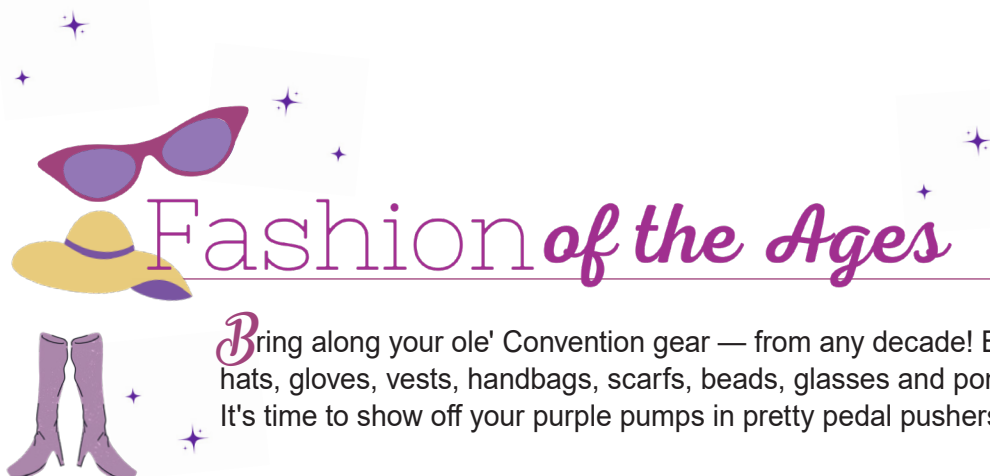

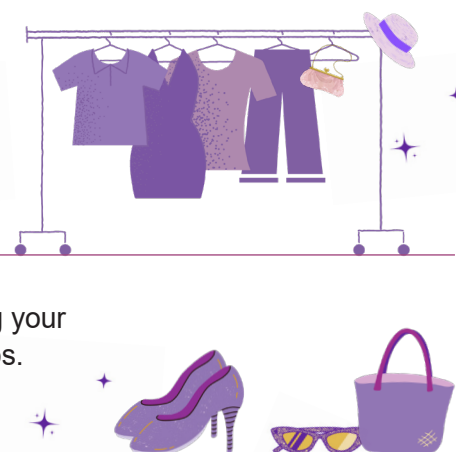

## Bylaw Change Proposal for Consideration by the 2022 LWML ND District Convention

### ARTICLE XV – MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS, Section 1a

**Rationale:** This is the title used by the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS), specifically for the Office of National Mission and the Office of International Mission

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Strike “boards” and insert “Offices”

**If adopted, will read:** a. Mission grant proposals shall be submitted in resolution form to the LWML ND District Vice President of Mission Grants at least six (6) months prior to the LWML ND District Convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML individuals, societies, units, zones, or LCMS Offices.

Anywhere the bylaws refer to “societies”.

**Rationale:** To conform to National LWML standards.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Strike “societies”

**If adopted, will read:** LWML group or unit

### Pastoral Counselor Message by Rev. Christopher Waldvogel, Jr. Counselor

Have the problems, worries and cares of this life taken their toll on you the last few years?

A global pandemic has left us with tragic deaths, along with significant physical and mental health issues.

The rise of inflation, war, strife and other worries plague us on a daily basis. Feeling overwhelmed and overmatched, many have resigned from caring about those around them. “That’s not my problem,” we say. “There is nothing I can do about it, anyway.”

Thanks be to God for Jesus, God in the flesh, who came to accomplish salvation and restoration for the whole world. Although Jesus was selective about dealing with shortsighted earthly concerns — such a man’s preoccupation about his share in the family’s inheritance and the social embarrassment of running out of wine at a wedding — Jesus had compassion for those around Him. When people felt themselves beyond the grace of God, Jesus brought hope. For those dealing with debilitating disease, Jesus brought healing. For those dealing with sin, Jesus brought forgiveness.
