### National and District "Mighty Mites"



National Mission Grant, Expanding God's Love in Uganda — LCMS Office of International Mission, Africa Region — \$92,000. The Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCU) is a steadily growing church body in eastern Africa, which locally trains deaconesses so they may assist the small number of Lutheran pastors throughout Uganda to teach the faith,

provide spiritual care, and show mercy to the communities. The grant provides local training to qualified women who would not be able to travel to Kenya for a two-year program, and to the church. It also allows for a land purchase attached to the established Lutheran Theological College Uganda, fencing, and a small dormitory for the women.







"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10). All 150 of the LCU congregations have many children. Half of the population is under eighteen and it is very common for at least half of the congregation to be children. There is a strong need for teaching the faith to families throughout Uganda. Ugandans value education and want their children to know Jesus, and the parents want to be confident in correctly teaching their children about Jesus. Deaconesses dedicated to teaching Christian education, greatly assist the pastors, as well as preparing the next

generation for service in the church. Their presence also helps the LCU become more well known in their communities as the mercy work is always connected to Christ through the LCU.

LWML North Dakota District Mission Project, Mercy Meals of North Dakota — \$5,000. Mercy Meals of North Dakota Mercy Meals of North Dakota was established by the board of Orphan Grain Train Branch #9 in the Spring of 2015 as a method of obtaining and providing food for the support of their mission projects overseas. Based in Jamestown, Mercy Meals of North Dakota brings the mission opportunity to various North Dakota organizations and communities by setting up a packing event in any location where there are willing volunteers to help. We are a satellite of the Mercy Meals organization operating out of Norfolk, NE in association with Orphan Grain Train, Inc. which is an RSO of the LCMS. We desire to ease the burden of hunger for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are in need by showing the love of Christ through the preparation of nutritious and low-cost meals. The Mercy Meals of North Dakota grant money is used primarily to purchase supplies for packing events for groups that are not able to raise funds to help pay for the supplies and gives them the opportunity to participate. Some funds are also used for equipment upgrade and replacement, and various office supply costs.





### Need Joy? Message by Rev. Christopher Waldvogel, Sr. Pastoral Counselor



**Need some joy in your morning routine? Add God's Word.** It might surprise you how often people wake up on the wrong side of the bed. According to a 2019 survey of 2,000 Americans, it happens 300 days out of the year — about six times a week! That's right. We muster a measly 65 days per year in which we happily welcome the day ahead.

Maybe cold weather, a late night, money woes, family worries, stress at your job or a combination of factors keep you lamenting under the covers. But what gets you going? What brings you out of your funk? A quick shower, brisk jog, or pricey "coffee" from Starbucks might provide a quick fix, but they don't seem to be offering a long-term solution to the root of the problem. Moses writes of God: "Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days," (Psalm 90:14).

Revived by God's Word, we rejoice that God created, ordered and numbered our days; we are glad all our days for they are a gift from Him. God alone bestows on us life and breath and pours out His goodness in abundance. Everything to support this body and life comes as an undeserved blessing from His hand.

Yet each day brings toil and trouble because we live in a fallen, broken world corrupted by man's fall into sin. And in our own corruption, we easily forget the lovingkindness God showers on us every day. Our Old Adam grouses about life's sorrows, easily forgetting all the joy we have in the Lord. Moses continues: "Make us glad for as many days as you have afflicted us, and for as many years as we have seen evil," (Psalm 90:15).

Amid our numerous grumpy awakenings, God's Word awakens our gladness in the Lord. Not only do the Scriptures

remind us of our many undeserved earthly blessings, they point us to Christ in whom all of God's promises are fulfilled. In Christ, we have the forgiveness of sins, the restoration of the fallen creation and the reversal of the curse. In Jesus, we truly see our fleeting days of sorrow coming to a permanent close.

Start each day with God's Word. Within its pages, God speaks of His unwavering love for you in Christ. A daily dose of Scripture helps put things in perspective that in Christ, your cause for joy far outweighs your cause for sorrow. The Gospel's Spirit-laden power reveals God's salvation in Christ for you and in you and graciously grants Moses' request: "Let your work be shown to your servants, and your glorious power to their children. ### Bus To Convention

### Your Guide to Submitting a District Grant Proposal

#### North Dakota District • 2024-2026

### LWML NORTH DAKOTA DISTRICT MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

Mission grant proposals shall be submitted in resolution form to the Vice President of Mission Grants by September 30 prior to the District convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML members, societies, units, zones and LCMS Boards. (Bylaws Article XV, Section1) Ministries seeking funding should:

- be mission in emphasis, extending the ministry of the Word;
- · fit into the plans and projections of the LCMS;
- · be current and ready for implementation;
- be on-going in nature, continuing after the grant money has been expended

#### **STEPS TO FOLLOW**

- Research the project thoroughly.
- · Does it fall within the framework of the criteria for LWML mission grants?
- LWML Mission Grant Criteria are:
- \* Must be mission in emphasis extending the ministry of the Word
- \* Must fit into the plans and projections of the LCMS
- \* Must be current and ready for implementation within the next two years
- \* Must be well-documented (must be able to answer all questions on Proposal Form)
- Speak or write to the people involved. Ask such questions as:
  - 1. Are there other funding sources? If this is a partial funding, who will fund the remainder?
  - 2. Will continued support be assured after the District LWML monies from this grant are expended?
  - 3. Who will be the contact person if the project is adopted?
  - 4. Will this person implement, administer the funds and conduct the follow-up? If not, who will?
  - 5. How many people will benefit from this project?
  - 6. Is there continued maintenance and support once the project has begun

#### WRITING THE PROPOSAL

Prepare the cover sheet of your mission grant proposal, including the following items:

- Name of grant or mission project
- Location of project
- Amount requested
- · Name and address of person submitting proposal
- Name and address information of the person within the project to whom the funds will be sent.

Prepare a separate detailed information paper (single-sided, single-spaced, maximum length 2 pages) about the ministry. The information should include:

- Project goal
- Needs
- · Purpose for which funds will be used
- · Tentative date funds will be used
- Budget and cost information
- Are there similar existing programs in your area? What? Where?
- · How does your program differ, broaden or support?
- Staff description: Who? How many? Qualifications?
- · Long term maintenance & sustainability
- · Additional reasons you feel this project is important
- Other comments or information.

Prepare a proposal in resolution form. Be concise and specific. Start with a purpose/goal statement. Include ministry needs, amount of funds requested and purpose for which the money will be used.

#### (Example)

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has instructed parents to bring up their children in the way of the Lord and has asked that little children be brought to Him; and

WHEREAS, JC Christian School is a necessary mission field in a new neighborhood and has already drawn new members to the LCMS church; and

WHEREAS, Bible-based materials vastly expand the Christian knowledge of our children; and

WHEREAS, up-to-date video equipment enhances learning capabilities;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League ND District in convention in Fargo, ND in June 2024 grant \$5,000 to JC Christian School for the purchase of audio-visual equipment and new Bible-based textbooks.



## Your Guide to Submitting a District Grant Proposal (continued from page 5)

Prepare 5–8 photos to be included with the proposal, either on a CD or to be sent electronically.

- Choose pictures that best illustrate your grant and communicate your mission.
- Write a short description for each photo.

The grant proposal must be submitted by September 30, 2023 to the Vice President of Mission Grants either as an email attachment with photos to: missiongrants@ndlwml.org OR 6 (six) copies and a CD of photos mailed to: Sue Corwin, 1811 6th Ave SW #12, Jamestown, ND 58401. After recommendation by the Mission Grants Committee, approval for ballot by the LWML ND Board of Directors and vote by the delegates in convention in June 2024, you will be contacted by July 1, 2024 as to whether or not your mission project has been chosen for funding. God bless you as you continue in His Word & work!
