See the entire list of what is needed on page 4, and remember, no gift is too small. A gift is a gift, and we are thankful for each one — no matter what kind of bag or box you fill!

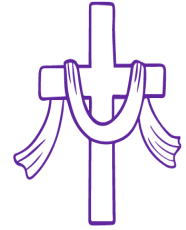

Christ Is Your Life by Rev. Christopher Waldvogel, Sr. Counselor



Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Let this Easter joy resound as Christ not only has been raised from the dead but also has been seated at the right hand of the Father, ruling and reigning over all things. By His gracious ordaining, Jesus has won your salvation, forgiven your sins and established you in God's Kingdom, joining your life to His by virtue of your baptism.

Think of the reality of this glorious statement. All that Christ won is now yours. You have a perfect standing before God, a totally restored relationship and a glorious inheritance. Upon our Lord's return, you will possess a sinless, glorious body like Christ's own. You will spend eternity in God's presence in a perfectly renewed creation without pain, regret, sin or death.

Yet it becomes easy to forget or even dismiss this truth. When life becomes overwhelming, disappointing, difficult, tedious, or discouraging, we might question God's love or even reject it all together. But what more do we need than what Christ has accomplished for us and in us?

Obviously, we need His Word and Spirit to remind us of and keep us confident of and sure in what God has so generously given. St. Paul writes to the Christians in Colossae: "Because you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." Paul doesn't mean that we should totally forget about our current life on earth. We simply shouldn't allow our blessings or our hardships to be the highlight of our life. And we definitely shouldn't try to embrace sin and hedonism as the means to have a full life. Christ came so that we could have life abundantly, and He gives that life to us now through Word and Sacrament.

The introduction to Article 8 of the Augsburg Confession in the readers edition to the Book of Concord states: "We understand that here on the earth, the Church is hidden because faith, or spiritual life, is 'hidden with Christ in God.' (But) this hidden Church has public, visible marks by which it is recognized with absolute certainty: Christ's Gospel and Sacraments, purely preached and administered."

Our life in Christ is our Easter joy now. But this will give way to an even greater Easter joy in the life of the world to come, where our life with Christ in God is no longer hidden.

Bylaw Change Proposal For Consideration By The 2024 LWML ND District Convention

ARTICLE XV - MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS

Rationale: This has become an outdated use.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: In Section 1 a. delete “in resolution form”

Existing bylaws read: Section 1a

Mission grant proposals shall be submitted in resolution form to the LWML ND District Vice President of Mission Grants at least six (6) months prior to the LWML ND District Convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML individuals, groups, units, zones, or LCMS Boards.

If adopted, will read: Section 1a

Mission grant proposals shall be submitted to the LWML ND District Vice President of Mission Grants at least six (6) months prior to the LWML ND District Convention. Proposals may be submitted by LWML individuals, groups, units, zones, or LCMS Boards.

ARTICLE XVI - FISCAL YEAR .

Rationale: To reflect current practice.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: In article name, strike “YEAR” and insert “BIENNIUM”.

Existing bylaws read: ARTICLE XVI – FISCAL YEAR

If adopted, will read: ARTICLE XVI – FISCAL BIENNIUM

ARTICLE XVI - FISCAL YEAR

Rationale: To provide a financial report with the same time frame as the LWML biennium. With the current fiscal period, any income and expenditures beginning March 1st go into the next fiscal period, and yet the LWML biennium ends with the convention held in June. This amendment allows the fiscal period and the biennium to coincide.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Proposed amendment: Strike “year” and insert “biennium”; and strike “March 1 to the last day of February inclusive” and insert “July 1 to June 30”.

Existing bylaws read: ARTICLE XVI – FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the LWML ND District shall be from March 1 to the last day of February inclusive. The LWML ND District Financial Secretary and LWML ND District Treasurer shall close the books on the last day of February.

If adopted, will read: ARTICLE XVI – FISCAL BIENNIUM

The fiscal biennium of the LWML ND District shall be from July 1 to June 30. The LWML ND District Financial Secretary and LWML ND District Treasurer shall close the books on the last day of June.
